The minutes of the Fairmont City Council meeting held on Monday, October 26, 2015 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Pro-tem Wes Clerc called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Council Members Terry Anderson, Chad Askeland, Bruce Peters and Jim Zarling were present. Also in attendance: City Administrator Mike Humpal, Public Works Director/City Engineer Troy Nemmers, City Attorney Elizabeth W. Bloomquist, Finance Director Paul Hoye and City Clerk Patricia Monsen.

It was moved by Council Member Peters, seconded by Council Member Zarling and carried to approve the minutes of the regular City Council meeting of October 12, 2015.

Humpal advised that council agenda item 12.1 would be pulled from the agenda.

Tobacco License Request

This application is different than what Staff generally sees for a tobacco license request. Usually, we have a retail establishment, that in addition to other products, is requesting to sell cigarettes and other tobacco products. This operation is a "Smoke Shop" and as such, Staff felt a more comprehensive background check was prudent.

The City's tobacco license application is a short one and half page application. The information on the initial application was incomplete and had some inconsistencies. Staff offered to pull the application off the October 26th council agenda, in lieu of recommending denial. Staff has reviewed a newly completed application which was completed under the supervision of the City Clerk and myself. We asked and received clarification on the questions we had concerning Mr. Hamdah's past conviction for a crime in 1988-89. With some direction from the LMC general counsel, Staff determined this conviction should not be used as a basis for denial due to the length of time that has past (30 years).

Background investigation by Fairmont Police Department Detective did uncover that Mr. Hamdah has relatives with varying degrees of separation (uncles, cousins, nephews) that have had some license and legal concerns with similar type stores in other Minnesota cities. However, there is no direct connection or proof of involvement by Mr. Hamdah, other than the fact that there is a family relationship.

Tobacco licenses are issued one year at a time and come back each year for renewal. The Council has the authority to revoke a license at any time it has clear evidence of City, State and Federal violations of the law.

At this time, City Staff does not find a legal reason to deny the tobacco application.
