The minutes of the Fairmont City Council meeting held on Monday, March 28, 2016 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Pro-tem Clerc called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Members Terry Anderson, Chad Askeland and Jim Zarling were present. Also in attendance: City Administrator Mike Humpal, City Attorney Elizabeth Bloomquist, Public Works Director/City Engineer Troy Nemmers, Finance Director Paul Hoye and City Clerk Patricia Monsen.

It was moved by Council Member Askeland, seconded by Council Member Anderson and carried to approve the minutes of the regular City Council meeting of March 14, 2016.

During open discussion, Council Member Askeland asked Nemmers about the conditions of the roads in Fairmont. Nemmers stated that some patch work has been done with cold mix, but that the majority of the repairs will be done with hot mix in early May.

Sergeant James Kotewa and Officer Jaime Bleess presented information regarding "Crisis Intervention Team" (CIT) trained officers.

Mayor Pro-tem Clerc opened the public hearing on proposed **Ordinance 2016-02**, which amends Chapter 18 of the City Code relating to camping in certain parks and food trucks. Dan Kastner of 702 Burton Lane stated that in the past he has gotten special permission to sell popcorn on the Fourth of July at Wards Park and he wondered if this would still be allowed. Humpal stated that it would be handled as in the past. There was no further public comment. Council Member Askeland made a motion to close the public hearing. Council Member Zarling seconded the motion and the motion carried. Council Member Zarling made a motion to adopt **Ordinance 2016-02**. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Askeland, Clerc, Zarling and Anderson all voted aye. No one voted nay. Mayor Pro-tem Clerc declared said motion passed.

Council Member Anderson made a motion to approve the parade permit for the American Legion for the Memorial Day parade. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Askeland made a motion to approve a request by Borderline Cruisers Car Club to barricade several downtown streets for their car show on June 11, 2016. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Anderson made a motion to approve a permit for the Freedom 5K and 10K race event on August 6, 2016. Council Member Zarling seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Anderson made a motion to authorize city staff to complete plans and specifications for a joint subdivision project with the school district and place the project out for bids. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Askeland made a motion to approve **Resolution 2016-08**, approving Eriael, LLC TIF Plan and Development Agreement Amendment. Council Member Anderson seconded

the motion. On roll call: Council Members Clerc, Zarling, Anderson and Askeland all voted aye. No one voted nay. Mayor Pro-tem Clerc declared said motion passed.

Council Member Askeland made a motion to approve the appointment of Greg Gellert to the Park Board. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Hoye advised that the 2016 Pay Equity Report for the City of Fairmont was accepted and the City is in compliance.

*WHEREAS,* these events will provide information and materials that support families to prevent child maltreatment and celebrate people who work with and support children and families; and,





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

**STATEMENT:** At the work session on March 28<sup>th</sup> the council directed staff to research the local option sales tax implementation process. The attached memo outlines the process, and time frames required. Staff recommends if the council wants to move forward with setting up the tax, that the city uses the upcoming November general election for the city wide vote rather than a special election at a later date.

**MOTION:** Authorize staff to develop a City Council Resolution authorizing the implementation of the process to create a Local Option Sales Tax.

#### Steps a political subdivision must follow to impose a local sales tax option:

In order to impose a local sales tax, a political subdivision must obtain enactment of a special law authorizing it to do so by taking the following steps in order:

- The governing body of a political subdivision must pass a resolution proposing the tax. The anticipated public hearing date will be June 14, 2016. The resolution needs to include at least:
  - Proposed tax rate. The proposed rate for Fairmont is anticipated to be 1/2%.
  - Amount of revenue to be raised and its intended use. The anticipated amount of money to be raised is approximately \$15 million. The intended use will be Regional Wellness Center, other recreation amenities and trails in the community.
  - Anticipated date that the tax will expire. The tax will expire when the amount raised reaches or exceeds \$15 million.
- The proposed tax, then must be submitted to and passed by the majority of the voters at a general election held at least 90 days after the resolution was passed. The political subdivision may not expend money to advertise or promote the tax. Fairmont will prepare its ballot question for the November 2016 election.
- 3. The political subdivision must request and have enacted a special law authorizing the imposition of the tax. Fairmont anticipates this legislation will be brought before the legislature in the 2017 legislative session.
- 4. The political subdivision must file local approval with the Secretary of State before the start of the next regular legislative session after the session in which the enabling law was enacted.
- 5. The political subdivision must pass an ordinance imposing the tax and notify the Commissioner of Revenue at least 90 days before the first day of the calendar quarter on which the taxes to be imposed.




