Airport Advisory Board Minutes, July 12, 2016 Board of Zoning Appeals Minutes, July 19, 2016 Fairmont Planning Commission Minutes, July 19, 2016 The minutes of the Fairmont City Council meeting held on Monday, July 11, 2016 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Randy Quring and Mayor Pro-tem Clerc were both absent. Council Member Askeland made a motion to have Council Member Zarling chair the meeting. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Council Member Jim Zarling called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Members Terry Anderson, Chad Askeland, Bruce Peters and Jim Zarling were present. Also in attendance: City Administrator Mike Humpal, City Attorney Elizabeth Bloomquist, Finance Officer Paul Hoye, Police Chief Greg Brolsma and City Clerk Patricia Monsen.

It was moved by Council Member Peters, seconded by Council Member Anderson and carried to approve the minutes of the regular City Council meeting of June 27, 2016.

During open discussion, Chief Greg Brolsma announced his intention to retire effective October 31, 2016. He thanked the community for allowing him to serve the citizens of Fairmont for thirty years.

Council Member Anderson invited all to attend an open house celebration on July 23, 2016 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Fairmont Community Airport honoring Lloyd Alsworth's induction into the Minnesota Aviation Hall of Fame in April, 2016.

Minnesota DNR Supervisor Ryan Doorenbos gave a presentation regarding the proposed stocking of muskies in the Fairmont Chain of Lakes. Bruce Moore, Mike Katzenmeyer, Travis Nielsen and Dean Petersen all spoke in favor of the stocking. Ron Dickenson spoke against the stocking. Council Member Anderson made a motion to put the issue of stocking muskies in the Fairmont Chain of Lakes back on the City Council Agenda for further discussion. The motion died for lack of a second.

Council Member Zarling gave a summary of the City Administrator's evaluation, which was held during a closed session on June 27, 2016. The evaluation was very good. The overall summary rating was 6.49, which falls between Fully Satisfied and Commendable.

Council Member Peters made a motion to approve the list of election judges for the August 9, 2016 and November 8, 2016 elections. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Peters made a motion to adopt **Resolution 2016-23**, calling for a public hearing on August 8, 2016 at 5:30 p.m. regarding proposed property tax abatement for the Zierke Built Manufacturing Project. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Peters, Zarling, Anderson and Askeland, all voted aye. No one voted nay. Council Member Zarling declared said motion passed.

Council Member Peters made a motion to adopt **Resolution 2016-24**, calling for a public hearing on August 22, 2016 at 5:30 p.m. regarding Tax Increment Financing District No. 27, The Fairmont Realty Group, LLC Project. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion. On roll

GRANT AGREEMENT FOR AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT EXCLUDING LAND ACQUISITION

This Agreement is by and between the State of Minnesota acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State"), and the City of Fairmont ("Recipient").

WHEREAS, the Recipient desires the financial assistance of the State for an airport improvement project ("Project") as described in Article 2 below; and

WHEREAS, the State is authorized by Minnesota Statutes Sections 360.015 (subdivisions 13 & 14) and 360.305 to provide financial assistance to eligible airport sponsors for the acquisition, construction, improvement, or maintenance of airports and other air navigation facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Recipient has provided the State with the plans, specifications, and a detailed description of the airport improvement Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. This Agreement is effective upon execution by the Recipient and the State, and will remain in effect until 12/31/2019.
- 2. The following table provides a description of the Project and shows a cost participation breakdown for each item of work:

- 3. The Project costs will not exceed \$826,422.54. The proportionate shares of the Project costs are: Federal: Committed \$346,241.00, Multi-Year Amount: \$0.00; State: \$372,603.26, and Recipient: \$107,578.28. This project is not estimated to be completed this fiscal year and the federal multiyear amount is an estimate only. These additional funds are not committed by the state and are only available after being made so by the U.S. government. Federal funds for the Project will be received and disbursed by the State. In the event federal reimbursement becomes available or is increased for this Project, the State will be entitled to recover from such federal funds an amount not to exceed the state funds advanced for this Project. No funds are committed under this Agreement until they are encumbered by the State. No more than 95% of the amount due under this Agreement will be paid by the State until the State determines that the Recipient has complied with all terms of this Agreement, and furnished all necessary records.
- 4. The Recipient will designate a registered engineer (the "Project Engineer") to oversee the Project work. If, with the State's approval, the Recipient elects not to have such services performed by a registered engineer, then the Recipient will designate another responsible person to oversee such work, and any references herein to the "Project Engineer" will apply to such responsible person.
- 5. The Recipient will complete the Project in accordance with the plans, specifications, and detailed description of the Project, which are on file with the State's Office of Aeronautics and are incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Any changes in the plans or specifications of the Project after the date of this Agreement will be valid only if made by written change order signed by the Recipient, the Project Engineer, and the contractor. Change orders must be submitted to the State. Subject to the availability of funds the State may prepare an amendment to this Agreement to reimburse the Recipient for the allowable costs of qualifying change orders.
- 6. The Recipient will make payments to its contractor on a work-progress basis. The Recipient will submit requests for reimbursement of certified costs to the State on state-approved forms. The State will reimburse the Recipient for the state and federal shares of the approved Project costs.

- a. At regular intervals, the Recipient or the Project Engineer will prepare a partial estimate in accordance with the terms of the contract, special provisions, and standard specifications for the Project(s). Partial estimates must be completed no later than one month after the work covered by the estimate is completed. The Project Engineer and the contractor must certify that each partial estimate is true and correct, and that the costs have not been included on a previous estimate.
- b. Following certification of the partial estimate, the Recipient will make partial payments to the contractor in accordance with the terms of the contract, special provisions, and standard specifications for the Project(s).
- c. Following certification of the partial estimate, the Recipient may request reimbursement from the State for costs eligible for federal and state participation. A copy of the partial estimate must be included with the Recipient's request for payment. Reimbursement requests and partial estimates should not be submitted if they cover a period in which there was no progress on the Project.
- d. Upon completion of the Project(s), the Recipient will prepare a final estimate in accordance with the terms of the contract, special provisions, and standard specifications for the Project(s). The final estimate must be certified by the Recipient, Project Engineer and the contractor.
- e. Following certification of the final estimate, the Recipient will make final payment to the contractor in accordance with the terms of the contract, special provisions, and standard specifications for the Project(s).
- f. Following certification of the final estimate, the Recipient may request reimbursement from the State for costs eligible for federal and state participation. A request for final payment must be submitted to the State along with those project records required by the State.
- 7. For a Project which involves the purchase of equipment, the Recipient will be reimbursed by the State in one lump sum after the Recipient: (1) has acquired both possession and unencumbered title to the equipment; and (2) has presented proof of payment to the State, and (3) a certificate that the equipment is not defective and is in good working order. The Recipient will keep such equipment, properly stored, in good repair, and will not use the equipment for any purpose other than airport operations.
- 8. If the Project involves force-account work or project donations, the Recipient must obtain the written approval of the State and Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Force-account work performed or project donations received without written approval by the State will not be reimbursed under this Agreement. Force-account work must be done in accordance with the schedule of prices and terms established by the Recipient and approved by the State.
- 9. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 360.305, subdivision 4 (g) (1), the Recipient will operate its airport as a licensed, municipally-owned public airport at all times of the year for a period of 20 years from the date the Recipient receives final reimbursement under this Agreement. The Airport must be maintained in a safe, serviceable manner for public aeronautical purposes only. The Recipient will not transfer, convey, encumber, assign, or abandon its interest in the airport or in any real or personal property, which is purchased or improved with State aid funds without prior written approval from the State. If the State approves such transfer or change in use, the Recipient must comply with such conditions and restrictions as the State may place on such approval. The obligations imposed by this clause survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 10. This Agreement may be terminated by the Recipient or State at any time, with or without cause, upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other party. Such termination will not remove any unfulfilled financial obligations of the Recipient as set forth in this Agreement. In the event of such a termination, the Recipient will be entitled to reimbursement for eligible expenses incurred for work satisfactorily performed on the Project up to the date of termination. The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not receive sufficient funding from the Minnesota Legislature or other funding source, or such funding is not provided at a level sufficient to allow for the continuation of the work covered by this Agreement. In the event of such termination, the Recipient will be reimbursed for work satisfactorily performed up to the effective date of such termination to the extent that funds are available. In the event of any complete or partial state government shutdown due to a failure to have a budget approved at the required time, the State may suspend this Agreement, upon notice to the Recipient, until such government shutdown ends, and the Recipient assumes the risk of non-payment for work performed during such shutdown.
- 11. Pursuant to Minnesota Rules 8800.2500, the Recipient certifies that (1) it presently has available sufficient unencumbered funds to pay its share of the Project; (2) the Project will be completed without undue delay; and (3) the Recipient has the legal authority to engage in the Project as proposed.

- 12. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 16C.05, subdivision 5, the Recipient will maintain such records and provide such information, at the request of the State, so as to permit the Department of Transportation, the Legislative Auditor, or the State Auditor to examine those books, records, and accounting procedures and practices of the Recipient relevant to this Agreement for a minimum of six years after the expiration of this Agreement.
- 13. The Recipient will save, defend, and hold the State harmless from any claims, liabilities, or damages including, but not limited to, its costs and attorneys' fees arising out of the Project which is the subject of this Agreement.
- 14. The Recipient will not utilize any state or federal financial assistance received pursuant to this Agreement to compensate, either directly or indirectly, any contractor, corporation, partnership, or business, however organized, which is disqualified or debarred from entering into or receiving a State contract. This restriction applies regardless of whether the disqualified or debarred party acts in the capacity of a general contractor, a subcontractor, or as an equipment or material supplier. This restriction does not prevent the Recipient from utilizing these funds to pay any party who might be disqualified or debarred after the Recipient's contract award on this Project.
- 15. All contracts for materials, supplies, or construction performed under this Agreement will comply with the equal employment opportunity requirements of Minnesota Statutes Section 181.59.
- 16. The amount of this Agreement is limited to the dollar amounts as defined in Article 3 above. Any cost incurred above the amount obligated by the State is done without any guarantee that these costs will be reimbursed in any way. A change to this Agreement will be effective only if it is reduced to writing and is executed by the same parties who executed this Agreement, or their successors in office.
- 17. For projects that include consultant services, the Recipient and its consultant will conduct the services in accordance with the work plan indicated in the Recipient's contract for consultant services, which shall be on file with the State's Office of Aeronautics. The work plan is incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The Recipient will confer on a regular basis with the State to coordinate the design and development of the services.
- 18. The parties must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, as it relates to all data provided to or by a party pursuant to this Agreement.
- 19. Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.
- 20. For projects including federal funding, the Recipient must comply with applicable regulations, including, but not limited to, Title 14 Code of Federal Regulations, subchapter I, part 151; and Minnesota Rules Chapter 8800. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number for the federal Airport Improvement Program is 20.106.
- 21. For all projects, the Recipient must comply, and require its contractors and consultants to comply, with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the work. The Recipient must advertise, let, and award any contracts for the project in accordance with applicable laws. The State may withhold payment for services performed in violation of applicable laws.
- 22. Under this Agreement, the State is only responsible for receiving and disbursing federal and state funds. Members present: Ian Bents, Margaret Dillard, Chris Pierce, Scott Unke, Ed Willett **Others present:** Judy Bryan, Sentinel; City Administrator Mike Humpal; Community Development Intern Matt Malvin; Councilman Terry Anderson

Chairman Pierce called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Minutes: The minutes of the June 7, 2016 meeting were approved as presented on a motion by Willett, seconded by Bents and carried.

Annual Reviews: Humpal reviewed the conditional use and home occupation permits up for review and presented staff's recommendation for all the permits to be renewed for another year. Bents made the motion to renew the permits as presented. The motion was seconded by Dillard and it carried.



Public Hearing: Proposed amendment to Fairmont City Code, Article IV General Development Regulations, adding Section 26-209 Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings.

Chairman Pierce opened the public hearing at 5:35 p.m. There was no one in attendance and no public comment. Humpal explained the new Temporary Health Care Dwelling law and the process a community can take to opt out of the law and leave land control in the hands of the community. Staff recommended to the Planning Commission to send Ordinance 2016-04 to the City Council with the recommendation to opt out of the Ordinance and to do so by the September 1st deadline imposed in Minnesota Statute 462.3593. A motion was made by Bents to close the public hearing at 5:45 p.m. and seconded by Dillard, motion carried. A motion was made by Willett to send Ordinance 2016-04 to the City Council with a recommendation to pass the resolution which opts the City out of the Temporary Health Care Dwelling requirements. The motion was seconded by Bents and carried.

Old Business: None

New Business: The Planning Commission reviewed TIF Project 27 for the redevelopment and removal of three substandard properties and construction of multi-family structures. Humpal went over the particulars of the project and explained that there was a need for student housing and the side benefit would be neighborhood revitalization. A motion by Unke, seconded by Dillard to adopt resolution finding that the tax increment plan amendment involving TIF 27 was in accordance with the City's comprehensive plan and overall development plan. Roll call: Bents - yes, Willett – yes, Unke – yes, Pierce – yes. Resolution was adopted and recommends the project to the City Council.

Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings of 2016 Allowing Temporary Structures – What it means for Cities

Introduction:

On May 12, 2016, Gov. Dayton signed, into law, a bill creating a new process for landowners to place mobile residential dwellings on their property to serve as a temporary family health care dwelling. Community desire to provide transitional housing for those with mental or physical impairments and the increased need for short term care for aging family members served as the catalysts behind the legislature taking on this initiative. The resulting legislation sets forth a short term care alternative for a "mentally or physically impaired person", by allowing them to stay in a "temporary dwelling" on a relative's or caregiver's property.²

Where can I read the new law?

Until the state statutes are revised to include bills passed this session, cities can find this new bill at 2016 Laws, Chapter 111.

Does the law require cities to follow and implement the new temporary family health care dwelling law?

Yes, unless a city opts out of the new law or currently allows temporary family health care dwellings as a permitted use.

Considerations for cities regarding the opt-out?

These new temporary dwellings address an emerging community need to provide more convenient temporary care. When analyzing whether or not to opt out, cities may want to consider that:

- The new law alters a city's level of zoning authority for these types of structures.
- While the city's zoning ordinances for accessories or recreational vehicles do not apply, these structures still must comply with setback requirements.
- A city's zoning and other ordinances, other than its accessory use or recreational vehicle ordinances, still apply to these structures. Because conflicts may arise between the statute and a city's local ordinances, cities should confer with their city attorneys to analyze their current ordinances in light of the new law.

² Some cities asked if other states have adopted this type of law. The only states that have a somewhat similar statute at the time of publication of this FAQ are North Carolina and Virginia. It is worth noting that some states have adopted Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) statutes to allow granny flats, however, these ADU statutes differ from Minnesota's Temporary Health Care Dwelling law.

- Although not necessarily a legal issue for the city, it seems worth mentioning that the
 permit process does not have the individual with the physical or mental impairment or that
 individual's power of attorney sign the permit application or a consent to release his or her
 data.
- The application's data requirements may result in the city possessing and maintaining nonpublic data governed by the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act.
- The new law sets forth a permitting system for both cities and counties³. Cities should consider whether there is an interplay between these two statutes.

Do cities need to do anything to have the new law apply in their city?

No, the law goes into effect Sept. 1, 2016 and automatically applies to all cities that do not opt out or don't already allow temporary family health care dwellings as a permitted use under their local ordinances.

Do cities lose the option to opt out after the Sept. 1, 2016 effective date?

No, the law does not set a deadline for opting out, so cities can opt out after Sept. 1, 2016. However, if the city has not opted out by Sept. 1, 2016, then the city must not only have determined a permit fee amount⁴ before that date (if the city wants to have an amount different than the law's default amount), but also must be ready on that date to accept applications and process the permits in accordance with the short timeline required by the law. Cities should consult their city attorney to analyze how to handle applications submitted after Sept. 1, 2016, but still pending at the time of a later opt out.

What if a city already allows a temporary family health care dwelling as a permitted use?

If the city already has designated temporary family health care dwellings as a permitted use, then the law does not apply and the city follows its own ordinance. The city should consult its city attorney for any uncertainty about whether structures currently permitted under existing ordinances qualify as temporary family health care dwellings.

What process should the city follow if it chooses to opt out of this statute?

Cities that wish to opt out of this law must pass an ordinance to do so. The statute does not provide clear guidance on how to treat this opt-out ordinance. However, since the new law adds section 462.3593 to the land use planning act (Minn. Stat. ch. 462), arguably, it may represent the adoption or an amendment of a zoning ordinance, triggering the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 462.357, subd. 2-4, including a public hearing with 10-day published notice. Therefore, cities may want to err on the side of caution and treat the opt-out ordinance as a zoning provision. ⁵

Does the League have a model ordinance for opting out of this program?

Can cities partially opt out of the temporary family health care dwelling law?

Not likely. The opt-out language of the statute allows a city, by ordinance, to opt out of the requirements of the law but makes no reference to opting out of parts of the law. If a city wanted a program different from the one specified in statute, the most conservative approach would be to opt out of the statute, then adopt an ordinance structured in the manner best suited to the city. Since the law does not explicitly provide for a partial opt out, cites wanting to just partially opt out from the statute should consult their city attorney.

Can a city adopt pieces of this program or change the requirements listed in the statute?

Similar to the answer about partially opting out, the law does not specifically authorize a city to alter the statutory requirements or adopt only just pieces of the statute. Several cities have asked if they could add additional criteria, like regulating placement on driveways, specific lot size limits, or anchoring requirements. As mentioned above, if a city wants a program different from the one specified in the statute, the most conservative approach would involve opting out of the statute in its entirety and then adopting an ordinance structured in the manner best suited to the city. Again, a city should consult its city attorney when considering adopting an altered version of the state law.

What is required in an application for a temporary family health care dwelling permit?

The mandatory application requests very specific information including, but not limited to:6

- Name, address, and telephone number of the property owner, the resident of the property (if different than the owner), and the primary care giver;
- Name of the mentally or physically impaired person;
- Proof of care from a provider network, including respite care, primary care or remote monitoring;
- Written certification signed by a Minnesota licensed physician, physician assistant or advanced practice registered nurse that the individual with the mental or physical impairment needs assistance performing two or more "instrumental activities of daily life;"⁷

- An executed contract for septic sewer management or other proof of adequate septic sewer management;
- An affidavit that the applicant provided notice to adjacent property owners and residents;
- A general site map showing the location of the temporary dwelling and the other structures on the lot; and
- Compliance with setbacks and maximum floor area requirements of primary structure.

The law requires all of the following to sign the application: the primary caregiver, the owner of the property (on which the temporary dwelling will be located) and the resident of the property (if not the same as the property owner). However, neither the physically disabled or mentally impaired individual nor his or her power of attorney signs the application.

Who can host a temporary family health care dwelling?

Placement of a temporary family health care dwelling can only be on the property where a "caregiver" or "relative" resides. The statute defines caregiver as "an individual, 18 years of age or older, who: (1) provides care for a mentally or physically impaired person; and (2) is a relative, legal guardian, or health care agent of the mentally or physically impaired person for whom the individual is caring." The definition of "relative" includes "a spouse, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, sibling, uncle, aunt, nephew or niece of the mentally or physically impaired person. Relative also includes half, step and in-law relationships."

Is this program just for the elderly?

No. The legislature did not include an age requirement for the mentally or physically impaired dweller. 8

Who can live in a temporary family health care dwelling and for how long?

The permit for a temporary health care dwelling must name the person eligible to reside in the unit. The law requires the person residing in the dwelling to qualify as "mentally or physically impaired," defined as "a person who is a resident of this state and who requires assistance with two or more instrumental activities of daily living as certified by a physician, a physician assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, licenses to practice in this state." The law specifically limits the time frame for these temporary dwellings permits to 6 months, with a one-time 6 month renewal option. Further, there can be only one dwelling per lot and only one dweller who resides within the temporary dwelling

What structures qualify as temporary family health care dwellings under the new law?

The specific structural requirements set forth in the law preclude using pop up campers on the driveway or the "granny flat" with its own foundation as a temporary structure. Qualifying temporary structures must:

- Primarily be pre-assembled;
- Cannot exceed 300 gross square feet;
- Cannot attach to a permanent foundation;
- Must be universally designed and meet state accessibility standards;
- Must provide access to water and electrical utilities (by connecting to principal dwelling or by other comparable means⁹);
- Must have compatible standard residential construction exterior materials;
- Must have minimum insulation of R-15;
- Must be portable (as defined by statute);
- Must comply with Minnesota Rules chapter <u>1360</u> (prefabricated buildings) or <u>1361</u> (industrialized/modular buildings), "and contain an Industrialized Buildings Commission seal and data plate or to American National Standards Institute Code 119.2" and
- Must contain a backflow check valve. 11

Does the State Building Code apply to the construction of a temporary family health care dwelling?

Mostly, no. These structures must meet accessibility standards (which are in the State Building Code). The primary types of dwellings proposed fall within the classification of recreational vehicles, to which the State Building Code does not apply. Two other options exist, however, for these types of dwellings. If these structures represent a pre-fabricated home, the federal building code requirements for manufactured homes apply (as stated in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 1360). If these structures are modular homes, on the other hand, they must be constructed consistent with the State Building Code (as stated in Minnesota Rules, Chapter 1361).

What health, safety and welfare requirements does this new law include?

Aside from the construction requirements of the unit, the temporary family health care dwelling must be located in an area on the property where "septic services and emergency vehicles can gain access to the temporary family health care dwelling in a safe and timely manner."

What local ordinances and zoning apply to a temporary health care dwelling?

The new law states that ordinances related to accessory uses and recreational vehicle storage and parking do not apply to these temporary family health care dwellings.

However, unless otherwise provided, setbacks and other local ordinances, charter provisions, and applicable state laws still apply. Because conflicts may arise between the statute and one or more of the city's other local ordinances, cities should confer with their city attorneys to analyze their current ordinances in light of the new law.

What permit process should cities follow for these permits?

The law creates a new type of expedited permit process. The permit approval process found in Minn. Stat. § 15.99 generally applies; however, the new law shortens the time frame within which the local governmental unit can make a decision on the permit. Due to the time sensitive nature of issuing a temporary dwelling permit, the city does not have to hold a public hearing on the application and has only 15 days (rather than 60 days) to either issue or deny a permit. For those councils that regularly meet only once a month, the law provides for a 30-day decision. The law specifically prohibits cities from extending the time for making a decision on the permit application. The new law allows the clock to restart if a city deems an application incomplete, but the city must provide the applicant written notice within five business days of receipt of the application identifying the missing information.

Can cities collect fees for these permits?

Cities have flexibility as to amounts of the permit fee. The law sets the fee at \$100 for the initial permit with a \$50 renewal fee, unless a city provides otherwise by ordinance

Can cities inspect, enforce and ultimately revoke these permits?

Yes, but only if the permit holder violates the requirements of the law. The statute allows for the city to require the permit holder to provide evidence of compliance and also authorizes the city to inspect the temporary dwelling at times convenient to the caregiver to determine compliance. The permit holder then has sixty (60) days from the date of revocation to remove the temporary family health care dwelling. The law does not address appeals of a revocation.

How should cities handle data it acquires from these permits?

The application data may result in the city possessing and maintaining nonpublic data governed by the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. To minimize collection of protected heath data or other nonpublic data, the city could, for example, request that the required certification of need simply state "that the person who will reside in the temporary family health care dwelling needs assistance with two or more instrumental activities of daily living", without including in that certification data or information about the specific reasons for the assistance, the types of assistance, the medical conditions or the treatment plans of the person with the mental illness or physical disability. Because of the complexities surrounding nonpublic data, cities should consult their city attorneys when drafting a permit application.

Should the city consult its city attorney?

Yes. As with any new law, to determine the potential impact on cities, the League recommends consulting with your city attorney.

ORDINANCE 2016-04

AMENDING FAIRMONT CITY CODE ARTICLE IV. GENERAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2016, Governor Dayton signed into law the creation and regulation of temporary family health care dwellings, codified at Minn. Stat § 462.3593, which permit and regulate temporary family health care dwellings; and

WHEREAS, subdivision 9 of Minn. Stat § 462.3593 allows cities to "opt out" of those regulations;

WHEREAS, the Fairmont Planning Commission held a public hearing on amending Article IV. General Development Regulations by adding City Code Section 26-209. Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings. No temporary family health care dwellings will be allowed in any residential districts of the City of Fairmont; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission met on July 19, 2016 received public input, reviewed and discussed the proposed change; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission recommends that the City Code be amended; and,

WHEREAS, after a public hearing the Fairmont City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City to amend Article IV. General Development Regulations by adding City Code Section 26-209. Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings. No temporary family health care dwellings will be allowed in any residential districts of the City of Fairmont.

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY OF FAIRMONT DOES ORDAIN, the Fairmont City Code Article IV. General Development Regulations be amended by adding:

The meeting of the Board of Zoning Appeals was convened at 4:30 p.m. by Vice Chair McMillan.

Minutes: On a motion by Davison, seconded by Wescott it was unanimously decided to approve the minutes of the December 1, 2015 meeting as presented.

Vice Chair McMillan introduced a variance request by **Jon Omvig** at **523 Budd Lake Drive**. The applicant is requesting a three foot interior side yard setback in lieu of the six foot required in City Code for a proposed garage/residence expansion. Community Development Intern Matt Malvin outlined City Staff's position on the proposed variance.

Jon Omvig is requesting a variance to allow a three (3) foot side yard setback in lieu of the six (6) foot setback required by the zoning code to expand the property owner's garage and add an addition to the home located at 523 Budd Lake Drive.

The property exists as a substandard lot of record with the lot width and side yard setbacks not meeting the requirements set forth in Chapter 26 of the Fairmont City Code. Setbacks aim to ensure adjoining properties are afforded access to adequate light and air.

Chapter 26 allows structures not meeting the required setbacks to be afforded the ability to be maintained, rebuilt, expanded and repositioned so long as they do not increase the area of development within the required setback.

The Community Development Department feels there are adequate solutions to the situation in which the area of substandard development would not increase. The contour of the land and the small lot size is common to many of the lakeshore properties within Fairmont. Granting of the variance would set a precedent as the circumstances within the request are not unique to a single property.

Recommendation:

The Community Development Department recommends a **denial** of the variance requested by Mr. Omvig before it in regard to the property located at 523 Budd Lake Drive.

On the grounds that:

- grounds that:

 1. The variance would confer a special privilege to the property owner, which is denied by this chapter to other lands, structures and buildings within the same area.
- 2. The garage could be rebuilt closer to the road (meeting front yard setback and building code) while maintaining its current side yard setback of five feet and current depth accompanied by an addition meeting the six foot setback and requiring no variance to the zoning code.
- 3. No special conditions exist.
- 4. If the City allows the variance the Board would have to approve anyone else along Budd Lake Drive, hence this sets a precedent that is inconsistent with 26-503(e).

Options:

- 1. Denial of the variance request on any or all of the grounds listed above.
- 2. Table the decision until next month.
- 3. Approve the variance request with or without conditions.

Next the Board heard from Jon Omvig.

Mr. Omvig first outlined his confusion with the application requirements, specifically#3 "statement why refusal of a variance would involve unnecessary hardship for the applicant". Minnesota Supreme Court ruled against cities hardships statements. As a result, the legislature changed language from unnecessary hardship to practical difficulty. The application had not been changed, but City Code had reflected the change. Mr. Omvig conceded that the confusion did not change the process, but thought it important to point out. Mr. Omvig went on to support his request. (attached)

Staff reiterated to the Board of Zoning Appeals that there was little basis for the variance request, nor did it cause practical difficulty in that Mr. Omvig could build his garage and residence addition only two foot narrower, which would meet the existing setback and conform with the shoreland overlay district (26-503 (e)), which prohibits any expansion of a nonconforming setback.

The Board expressed their concerns for setting a precedence and discussed that there were other options to mitigate water run-off into the garage.

Unke motioned to deny the request for a variance based on City Staff summary and findings on the situation. The motion was seconded by Davison. The motion carried unanimously.

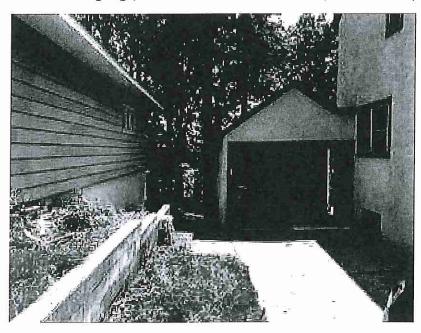
Chairman McMillan hearing no other business asked for a motion to adjourn. Motion by Wescott, seconded by Unke to adjourn at 4:57 p.m.



I am requesting a nonuse variance to the side yard setback. Currently I have a single car garage attached to the rear of the house, which is an allowed use in the R1 Single Family Zoning District. The foundation of the garage is damaged due to excess water flow into the garage. I am requesting a two foot reduction of the existing sideyard setback to allow relocation of the garage to the front/side of the house.

A hardship is caused by the fact that topography limits the ability to reconstruct a garage in the rear lot of the house. This is evidenced by the fact that all residences on the south side of Budd Lake Drive have garages located approximately even with the front of the house. Existing side yard setbacks on both sides of the lot are inadequate to allow construction of a garage without a sideyard variance (the west setback is currently 15.5 feet). Additionally, moving the garage to the front of the house increases the effective setback of the house from the top of the lakebank, which is a goal of the Shoreland Overlay District. Reducing the sideyard to three feet still provides adequate access to the rear lot, and does not negatively impact the adjacent property to the east. The hardship is not self-imposed, as the unsuitable topography is naturally occurring and the inadequate sideyard was in existence prior to my purchase of the property.

Topography of the lot falls about ten feet from the front of the house to the rear of the garage. Even though the garage is constructed on an elevated platform, it is still lower than the street. This results in sheetflow drainage down the driveway into the garage. This has caused a deterioration of the foundation, due to excess water during the spring/summer and freeze/thaw during the winter. The prior owner tried to alleviate the problem by adding an additional pour to the concrete floor, however it is inadequate to correct the drainage problem. Other corrections are not reasonable due to the relation of the garage to the house and to the adjacent residence. The images below illustrate the current location of the garage with the downhill drainage and the existing sideyard. They also illustrate that the adjacent property owner utilizes a concrete retaining wall and a series of terraces to control the steep grade between their garage, located in the front of the house, and their rear yard.







I am proposing to construct a new garage to line up approximately with the front of the house. This removes the condition where drainage flows into the front of the garage. The current garage maintains a five foot sideyard setback, and extends westward past the east side of the house. Moving the garage to the front of the house requires a reduction in the existing sideyard setback by two feet. The image below is a conceptual rendering of the single car garage located at the front of the house.

Chairman Pierce called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Minutes: The minutes of the June 7, 2016 meeting were approved as presented on a motion by Willett, seconded by Bents and carried.

Annual Reviews: Humpal reviewed the conditional use and home occupation permits up for review and presented staff's recommendation for all the permits to be renewed for another year. Bents made the motion to renew the permits as presented. The motion was seconded by Dillard and it carried.

Public Hearing: Proposed amendment to Fairmont City Code, Article IV General Development Regulations, adding Section 26-209 Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings.

Chairman Pierce opened the public hearing at 5:35 p.m. There was no one in attendance and no public comment. Humpal explained the new Temporary Health Care Dwelling law and the process a community can take to opt out of the law and leave land control in the hands of the community. Staff recommended to the Planning Commission to send Ordinance 2016-04 to the City Council with the recommendation to opt out of the Ordinance and to do so by the September 1st deadline imposed in Minnesota Statute 462.3593. A motion was made by Bents to close the public hearing at 5:45 p.m. and seconded by Dillard, motion carried. A motion was made by Willett to send Ordinance 2016-04 to the City Council with a recommendation to pass the resolution which opts the City out of the Temporary Health Care Dwelling requirements. The motion was seconded by Bents and carried.

Old Business: None

New Business: The Planning Commission reviewed TIF Project 27 for the redevelopment and removal of three substandard properties and construction of multi-family structures. Humpal went over the particulars of the project and explained that there was a need for student housing and the side benefit would be neighborhood revitalization. A motion by Unke, seconded by Dillard to adopt resolution finding that the tax increment plan amendment involving TIF 27 was in accordance with the City's comprehensive plan and overall development plan. Roll call: Bents - yes, Willett – yes, Unke – yes, Pierce – yes. Resolution was adopted and recommends the project to the City Council.

There was no other business to come before the Planning Commission. On a motion by Willett, seconded by Bents, the meeting was adjourned.
