The minutes of the Fairmont City Council meeting held on Monday, October 24, 2016 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Wallace called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Members Terry Anderson, Chad Askeland, Wes Clerc, Bruce Peters and Jim Zarling were present. Also in attendance: Public Works Director/City Engineer Troy Nemmers, Finance Director Paul Hoye, City Attorney Elizabeth W. Bloomquist, Chief Greg Brolsma and City Clerk Patricia Monsen.

It was moved by Council Member Anderson, seconded by Council Member Clerc and carried to approve the minutes of the regular City Council meeting of October 10, 2016.

During open discussion, Nemmers announced the details of the Fall Leaf Pickup in the City. All information is on the City's website and published in the Sentinel.

Council Member Peters requested considering changing the name of Oakwood Street to Hazelmere Street.

Mayor Wallace read a thank you note from YOCO, Youth Coalition, for the city and communities support.

Mayor Wallace also thanked all the candidates running for city positions and reminded all citizens to get out and vote. The voting will be at the Knights of Columbus Hall on November 8, 2016 and the polls are open from 7:00 a.m. -8:00 p.m.

Mayor Wallace presented a plaque to Chief Greg Brolsma in recognition of and appreciation for 30 years of distinguished service and commitment to the City of Fairmont and its citizens. Chief Brolsma thanked the community for allowing him to serve them and also spoke of all of the department's accomplishments.

Mayor Wallace proclaimed November 12, 2016 as Poppy Day in the City of Fairmont. Ardis Meyer from the Legion Ladies Auxiliary addressed the council and advised that 100% of all poppy sales go to benefit Veterans and their families.

Mayor Wallace proclaimed November 10, 2016 as Community Education and Recreation Day in the City of Fairmont. Roni Dauer addressed the council and thanked them and the citizens for the support. Dauer invited everyone to CER's open house on November 10, 2016 from 9:00 a.m. -4:00 p.m.

Mayor Wallace proclaimed November 7, 2016 as "Elroy (Ernie) Nuss" Day and recipient of the Golden Deeds Award by the Fairmont Exchange Club.

Mayor Wallace opened the public hearing on a code amendment to allow accessory structures to be built on abutting property with conditions outlined in **Ordinance 2016-06**. The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend this adoption. There was no public input. Council Member Zarling made a motion to close the public hearing. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion and the motion carried. Council Member Anderson made a motion to adopt **Ordinance 2016-06**. Council Member Peters seconded the motion. On roll call: Council

members Terry Anderson, Chad Askeland, Wes Clerc, Bruce Peters and Jim Zarling all voted aye. No one voted nay. Mayor Wallace declared said motion passed.

Council Member Zarling made a motion to approve the application for a solicitor's license by American Exteriors. Council Member Askeland seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Peters made a motion to approve **Resolution 2016-38**, approving the submission of an application to DEED for a grant under the Minnesota Investment Fund program to assist with the expansion of Zierke Built Manufacturing to be used for the creation of jobs. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Wes Clerc, Bruce Peters, Jim Zarling, Terry Anderson and Chad Askeland all voted aye. No one voted nay. Mayor Wallace declared said motion passed.

Council Member Anderson made a motion to approve the payment of the October, 2016 bills in the amount of \$807,022.64. Council Member Peters seconded the motion and the motion carried.



(water-oriented structure) in the Shoreland Overlay District

<u>Introduction</u>: Section 26-503 of Fairmont's City Code "Shoreland Overlay District" allows boathouses to be established with a conditional use permit. The structural setback in the Shoreland Overlay District is fifty (50) feet from the ordinary high water level for sewered lots. This fifty (50) foot setback is called the shore impact zone and boathouses or water-oriented structures are allowed if the conditional use permit is granted.

<u>Review Standards</u>: The Planning Commission and pertinent staff shall review applications for conditional use permits based upon the following standards:

- 1. Must be in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. Must not be detrimental or injurious to the general vicinity and uses already permitted in the area.
- 3. Not impede the normal and orderly development of surrounding vacant property.
- 4. Will be served by adequate utilities, public roads, and municipal facilities. Such requirements for public facilities shall not be detrimental to the economic welfare of the city.
- 5. Must not cause offensive odors, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration that would be injurious or a nuisance to adjacent uses and the surrounding area.
- 6. Will conform to specific standards of this chapter applicable to the particular use.

<u>Conditions for Conditional Use</u>: The Planning Commission may recommend conditions relating to the granting of a conditional use permit as they deem necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this chapter and protect the general welfare of the city. Recommended conditions may include the following general conditions (if applicable) and shall include specific conditions in this chapter:

- 1. That the architectural appearance and functional plan of the building and site shall not be so dissimilar to the existing buildings or area so as to cause impairment in property values or constitute a blighting influence within a reasonable distance of the lot.
- 2. That the entire site other than that taken up by a building, structure, or plantings shall be surfaced with a material to control dust and drainage. This surfacing is subject to approval by appropriate city staff.
- 3. That the lighting shall be accomplished in such a way as to have no direct source of light visible from adjacent land in residential use or from public right-of-way.

- 4. That vehicular access points shall create a minimum of conflict with through traffic movement and shall comply with the requirements of this chapter.
- 5. That open storage and refuse from the use shall be adequately contained and controlled on-site.
- 6. Any other condition as deemed necessary to protect the public health, safety and general welfare.

Staff Review and Recommendation: This section of Fairmont's code is nothing new and was already a part of the zoning code when the State of Minnesota mandated cities to adopt the shoreland management laws. In 1986, the zoning code allowed boathouses with a conditional use permit, but in 1992 the state expanded the definition of boathouses to mean water-oriented structures. These structures can be used to store boats, fishing poles, motors, water skis, life jackets, oars and any other water-oriented or marine equipment.

Staff has reviewed the State's shoreland rules which allow one (1) water-oriented accessory structure such as a boathouse to a <u>maximum</u> of 400 sq.ft. It also cannot exceed 10 feet in height or 20 feet in width along the shoreline. The color must be natural or earth toned and if possible it should be screened from the lake with vegetation. The Gochanours have agreed to comply with the above rules and therefore staff recommends approval of the conditional use permit with the following conditions:

- 1) The structure not exceed 400 sq.ft. or 10 feet in height nor 20 feet in width.
- 2) The color to be natural, earth tone or match the house.
- 3) Vegetative screening to be planted and maintained on the sides of this structure.

Action: The Commission has the following options:

- 1. Recommend approval to the City Council with any applicable conditions the Planning Commission deems necessary.
- 2. Recommend denial by stating reasons for denial (this would be final unless the applicant appeals the decision to the City Council).
- 3. Table this application for more information and continue the public hearing at the December Planning Commission meeting.
