- 1. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Chuck Omvig to approve the agenda. Motion passed.
- 2. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Robyn Buhmann to approve the minutes of the meeting on January 18, 2022. With the change to item 5, second sentence to read "The city administrator shall have;" Motion passed
- 3. Motion by Terry Anderson, 2nd by Chuck Omvig to not accept language by the city attorney in Sec 1.02. Moved by Dale Martens, 2nd by Jon Davis to close debate, motion passed. Terry Anderson's motion failed. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Tom Izen to accept Sec. 1.02 as written by the city attorney. Motion passed.
- 4. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Robynn Buhmann to accept as recommended by the city attorney to add "no less than" to the first sentence in Sec 2.10. Motion passed.
- 5. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Tom Izen to accept as recommended by the city attorney dropping the last sentence in Sec. 2.10 and replacing it with: "The term of the city administrator, and the term of any renewal thereafter, shall be established at the time of appointment or renewal, and shall be reflected in a written contract with the city administrator. The city administrator shall be subject to an annual review by the city council." Motion passed.
- 6. Motion by Jay Maynard, 2nd by Ken Reiman as recommended by the city attorney to remove "for an indefinite term" from the first sentence in Sec 2.10. Motion Passed. Sec 2.10 now reads "The city council, by an affirmative vote of no less than three (3) of the five (5) council members, shall appoint a city administrator and fix the administrator's compensation. The city administrator shall have a bachelor's degree or master's degree in public administration, public affairs or public policy. Emphasis shall be placed on the following qualifications; 1) three years of increased responsibility in leadership/management roles within a municipal or government setting; 2) possess strong financial aptitude and demonstrated budget and financial management skills; 3) working knowledge of municipal finance, budgeting and strategic planning; 4) display a firm understanding of the complexities of municipal utilities; 5) be a highly collaborative leader with a communicative, team oriented, and approachable management style. The term of the city administrator, and the term of any renewal thereafter, shall be established at the time of appointment or renewal, and shall be reflected in a written contract with the city administrator. The city administrator shall be subject to an annual review by the city council.

Moved by Jon Davis and 2nd by Dale Martens to close debate. Motion passed. Chuck Omvig motion passed.
