Independent Auditor's Report

Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council City of Fairmont Fairmont, Minnesota

We have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the discretely presented component unit, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City of Fairmont, Minnesota, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to basic financial statements, which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements and have issued our report thereon dated June 2, 2023.

Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the City's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the City's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as described in the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Responses on Internal Control, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be a material weakness identified as Audit Finding 2022-001.

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Report on Matters Identified as a Result of the Audit of the Basic Financial Statements

Honorable Mayor, Members of the City Council and Management City of Fairmont Fairmont, Minnesota

In planning and performing our audit of the basic financial statements of the governmental activities, business-type activities, the discretely presented component unit, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City of Fairmont, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, we considered the City's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control over financial reporting.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and, therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that have not been identified. In addition, because of inherent limitations in internal control, including the possibility of management override of controls, misstatements due to error, or fraud may occur and not be detected by such controls. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be a material weakness.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over financial reporting, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the City's basic financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A reasonable possibility exists when the likelihood of an event occurring is either reasonably possible or probable as defined as follows:

- *Reasonably possible*. The chance of the future event or events occurring is more than remote but less than likely.
- *Probable*. The future event or events are likely to occur.

The material weakness identified is stated within this letter.

A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

The accompanying memorandum also includes financial analysis provided as a basis for discussion. The matters discussed herein were considered by us during our audit and they do not modify the opinion expressed in our Independent Auditor's Report dated June 2, 2023, on such statements.

This communication, which is an integral part of our audit, is intended solely for the information and use of the City Council, management, others within the City, and state oversight agencies and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.

City of Fairmont Material Weakness

Material Audit Adjustment

We proposed an audit adjustment that we considered, both individually and in the aggregate, to be quantitatively material to the financial statements. This condition could adversely affect the City's ability to present financial statements free of material misstatements. The following area needed adjustment: accrued payroll.

We have audited the basic financial statements of the governmental activities, business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component unit, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022. Professional standards require that we advise you of the following matters related to our audit.

Our Responsibility in Relation to the Financial Statement Audit

As communicated in our engagement letter, our responsibility, as described by professional standards, is to form and express opinions about whether the basic financial statements prepared by management with your oversight are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our audit of the basic financial statements does not relieve you or management of its respective responsibilities.

Our responsibility, as prescribed by professional standards, is to plan and perform our audit to obtain reasonable, rather than absolute, assurance about whether the basic financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit of the basic financial statements includes consideration of internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, as part of our audit, we considered the internal control of the City solely for the purpose of determining our audit procedures and not to provide any assurance concerning such internal control.

We are also responsible for communicating significant matters related to the audit that are, in our professional judgement, relevant to your responsibilities in overseeing the financial reporting process. However, we are not required to design procedures for the purpose of identifying other matters to communicate to you.

Generally accepted accounting principles provide for certain Required Supplementary Information (RSI) to supplement the basic financial statements. Our responsibility with respect to the RSI, which supplements the basic financial statements, is to apply certain limited procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. However, the RSI was not audited and, because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI.

Our responsibility for the supplementary information accompanying the basic financial statements, as described by professional standards, is to evaluate the presentation of the supplementary information in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole and to report on whether the supplementary information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

Our responsibility with respect to the other information in documents containing the audited basic financial statements and auditor's report does not extend beyond the basic financial information identified in the report. We have no responsibility for determining whether this other information is properly stated. This other information was not audited, and we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

Our Responsibility in Relation to Government Auditing Standards

As communicated in our engagement letter, part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the basic financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of the City's compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of basic financial statement amounts. However, the objective of our tests was not to provide an opinion on compliance with such provisions.

Planned Scope and Timing of the Audit

We conducted our audit consistent with the planned scope and timing we previously communicated to you.

Compliance with All Ethics Requirements Regarding Independence

The engagement team, others in our firm, as appropriate, our firm, and our network firms have complied with all relevant ethical requirements regarding independence.

Significant Risks Identified

We have identified the following significant risks of material misstatement:

- Risk of Improper Revenue Recognition Revenue recognition is considered a fraud risk on substantially all engagements as it is generally the largest line item impacting a City's change in fund balance or net position.
- Risk of Misappropriation of Assets Misappropriation of assets is considered a risk in substantially all engagements as assets may be misappropriated due to fraud or error.
- Risk of Management Override of Controls Management override of internal control is considered a risk in substantially all engagements as management may be incentivized to produce better results.

Qualitative Aspects of the City's Significant Accounting Practices

Significant Accounting Policies

Management has the responsibility to select and use appropriate accounting policies. A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the City is included in the notes to basic financial statements. There have been no initial selection of accounting policies and no changes to significant accounting policies or their application during 2022. No matters have come to our attention that would require us, under professional standards, to inform you about (1) the methods used to account for significant unusual transactions and (2) the effect of significant accounting policies in controversial or emerging areas for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

Significant Accounting Estimates

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the basic financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's current judgements. Those judgements are normally based on knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the basic financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ markedly from management's current judgements. The most sensitive estimates affecting the basic financial statements relate to:

Qualitative Aspects of the City's Significant Accounting Practices (Continued)

Significant Accounting Estimates (Continued)

Depreciation – The City is currently depreciating its capital assets over their estimated useful lives, as determined by management, using the straight-line method.

Total Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) Liability, Deferred Outflows of Resources Related to OPEB and Deferred Inflows of Resources Related to OPEB – These balances are based on an actuarial study using the estimates of future obligations of the City for post employment benefits.

Net Pension Liability, Deferred Outflows of Resources Relating to Pensions and Deferred Inflows of Resources Relating to Pensions – These balances are based on an allocation by the pension plans using estimates based on contributions.

We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop the accounting estimates and determined that they are reasonable in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole and in relation to the applicable opinion units.

Financial Statement Disclosures

Certain basic financial statement disclosures involve significant judgment and are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The basic financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Significant Difficulties Encountered during the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management relating to the performance of the audit.

Uncorrected and Corrected Misstatements

For the purposes of this communication, professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that we believe are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Further, professional standards require us to also communicate the effects of uncorrected misstatements related to prior periods on the relevant classes of transactions, account balances or disclosures, and the basic financial statements taken as a whole and each applicable opinion unit. Management did not identify, and we did not notify them of any uncorrected financial statement misstatements.

In addition, professional standards require us to communicate to you all material, corrected misstatements that were brought to the attention of management as a result of our audit procedures. The following material misstatement that we identified as a result of our audit procedures was brought to the attention of and corrected by management.

Accrued Payroll was understated

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, concerning a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, which could be significant to the City's basic financial statements or the auditor's report. No such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Representations Requested from Management

We have requested certain written representations from management, which are included in the management representation letter.

Management's Consultations with Other Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters. Management has informed us that, and to our knowledge, there were no consultations with other accountants regarding auditing and accounting matters.

Other Significant Matters, Findings, or Issues

In the normal course of our professional association with the City, we generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, significant events or transactions that occurred during the year, operating and regulatory conditions affecting the City, and operational plans and strategies that may affect the risks of material misstatement. None of the matters discussed resulted in a condition to our retention as the City's auditor.

Other Information Included in Annual Reports

Pursuant to professional standards, our responsibility as auditors for other information, whether financial or nonfinancial, included in the City's annual reports, does not extend beyond the information identified in the audit report, and we are not required to perform any procedures to corroborate such other information.

We applied certain limited procedures to the RSI that supplements the basic financial statements. Our procedures consisted of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We did not audit the RSI and do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI.

With respect to the supplementary information accompanying the financial statements, we made certain inquiries of management and evaluated the form, content and methods of preparing the information to determine that the information complies with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the method of preparing it has not changed from the prior period, and the information is appropriate and complete in relation to our audit of the financial statements. We compared and reconciled the supplementary information to the underlying accounting records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves.

Other Information Included in Annual Reports (Continued)

We were not engaged to report on the other information accompanying the basic financial statements but are not RSI. Such information has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements, and accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

Our responsibility also includes communicating to you any information which we believe is a material misstatement of fact. Nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that such information, or its manner of presentation, is materially inconsistent with the information, or manner of its presentation, appearing in the basic financial statements.

The following pages provide graphic representation of select data pertaining to the financial position and operations of the City for the past five years. Our analysis of each graph is presented to provide a basis for discussion of past performance and how implementing certain changes may enhance future performance. A subsequent discussion of this information should be useful for planning purposes.


General Fund

Total fund balance in the General Fund increased 6.32% in 2022 to \$7,466,493. General Fund revenues and other financing sources exceeded by expenditures and other financing uses by \$443,534 during 2022. A more detailed analysis of the General Fund revenue and expenditure components are presented on the following pages.

The City's fund balance policy establishes an unrestricted fund balance range of 55%-65% of the subsequent year's budgeted expenditures. The current General Fund unrestricted fund balance represents 70.9% of 2022 General Fund budgeted expenditures, or eight and half months of those budgeted expenditures. These percentages are consistent with a Statement of Position issued by the Office of the State Auditor which recommended an unrestricted General Fund balance of between 35% to 50% of budgeted revenues and no less than five months of operating expenditures.

A five year history of General Fund balance is shown below.


General Fund Balance




General Fund Revenues

General Fund Revenues 2022




General Fund Revenues 2021

The chart below shows the City's revenues by source for the last five years. Property taxes decreased \$146,440 from 2021 to 2022 due to moving the new public works building debt service levy to a debt service fund. Miscellaneous revenues decreased \$88,050 mainly due to a change in fair market value of investments due to the worsening market conditions.


General Fund Revenues




General Fund Expenditures

General Fund Expenditures 2022




General Fund Expenditures 2021

Five year trend information for General Fund expenditures by function is shown below. From 2021 to 2022 expenditures increased \$283,502. General Government increased by \$93,045 due to taking down more dilapidated houses. Culture and recreation increased \$76,441 due to increased hours at the aquatic park. Other functions had minor variances from the prior year.



The chart above compares actual revenues and expenditures to amounts budgeted in the General Fund for 2022. Actual General Fund revenues were under budget by \$5,328, or 0.1%. All sources of revenue were relatively consistent with budgeted amounts.

Total actual expenditures were under budgeted expenditures by \$338,017, or 3.7%. Public safety was \$210,529 or 5.4% under budget mostly related to personnel costs. Remaining expenditure categories showed minor budget variations.


Water Fund

Water Fund operating results over the last five years are presented below. Operating revenues have exceeded operating expenses in four out of the five years presented. Operating revenue in the Water Fund increased 11.4% over the prior year as a result of increased usage and rate adjustments. Expenses for the year decreased \$816,555, mostly due to the lime pond project costs from the prior year being larger than the current year costs.



Sewer Fund


Sewer Fund operating results over the last five years are presented below. Operating revenues have exceeded operating expenses in in all five years presented. Operating revenues increased \$689,411, or 26.1% due to rate adjustments and a large insurance claim, and operating expenses increased \$615,845 or 29.3% due to Sewer Plant repairs and digester cleaning.



Storm Water Fund


Operating results of the Storm Water Fund are presented below. This Fund has been able to generate operating income with and without depreciation for each of the last five years. From 2021 to 2022, operating revenues of the Fund increased \$318. Operating expenses for the Fund increased \$31,548, or 5.9% due to increased depreciation related to large capital asset additions.

Electric Fund,


Operating results of the Electric Fund are presented below. This Fund has been able to generate operating income with and without depreciation for all of the last five years. From 2021 to 2022, operating revenues of the Fund stayed relatively consistent. Operating expenses for the Fund increased \$444,295, or 3% due to increased purchased power costs related to increased usage.



Liquor Fund


Liquor Fund operating trends are illustrated on the graphs below and on the following page. Sales decreased by 0.3%, from \$4,551,173 in 2021 to \$4,539,324 in 2022. Cost of sales had an increase of 0.7%, from \$3,223,150 in 2021 to \$3,245,750 in 2022.

Gross profit percentage decreased from 29.2% in 2021 to 28.5% in 2022. The Liquor Fund had operating income of \$640,537 in 2022, a decrease from the operating income of \$752,103 in 2021. This was primarily due to increased costs of goods.

Executive Summary

The following is an executive summary of financial related updates to assist you in staying current on emerging issues in accounting and finance. This summary will give you a preview of the new standards that have been recently issued and what is on the horizon for the near future. The most recent and significant updates include:

- Accounting Standard Update GASB Statement No. 96 Subscription-Based Information Technology Arrangements
 - GASB has issued GASB Statement No. 96 relating to accounting and financial reporting for subscription-based information technology arrangements. The requirements of this Statement will improve financial reporting by establishing a definition for subscription-based information technology arrangements and providing uniform guidance for accounting and financial reporting for transactions that meet that definition.
- Accounting Standard Update GASB Statement No. 100 Accounting Changes and Error Corrections
 - GASB has issued GASB Statement No. 100 relating to accounting and financial reporting for accounting changes and error corrections. The requirements of this Statement will improve the clarity of the accounting and financial reporting requirements for accounting changes and error corrections, which will result in greater consistency in application in practice. In turn, more understandable, reliable, relevant, consistent, and comparable information will be provided to financial statement users for making decisions or assessing accountability.
- Accounting Standard Update GASB Statement No. 101 Compensated Absences GASB has issued GASB Statement No. 101 relating to accounting and financial reporting for compensated absences. The unified recognition and measurement model in this Statement will result in a liability for compensated absences that more appropriately reflects when a government incurs an obligation. In addition, the model can be applied consistently to any type of compensated absence and will eliminate potential comparability issues between governments that offer different types of leave.

The following are extensive summaries of the current updates. As your continued business partner, we are committed to keeping you informed of new and emerging issues. We are happy to discuss these issues with you further and their applicability to your City.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 96 – Subscription-Based Information Technology Arrangements

This Statement provides guidance on the accounting and financial reporting for subscription-based information technology arrangements (SBITAs) for government end users (governments). This Statement (1) defines a SBITA; (2) establishes that a SBITA results in a right-to-use subscription asset – an intangible asset – and a corresponding subscription liability; (3) provides the capitalization criteria for outlays other than subscription payments, including implementation costs of a SBITA; and (4) requires note disclosures regarding a SBITA. To the extent relevant, the standards for SBITAs are based on the standards established in Statement No. 87, Leases, as amended.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 96 – Subscription-Based Information Technology Arrangements (Continued)

A SBITA is defined as a contract that conveys control of the right to use another party's (a SBITA vendor's) information technology (IT) software, alone or in combination with tangible capital assets (the underlying IT assets), as specified in the contract for a period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction.

The subscription term includes the period during which a government has a noncancellable right to use the underlying IT assets. The subscription term also includes periods covered by an option to extend (if it is reasonably certain that the government or SBITA vendor will exercise that option) or to terminate (if it is reasonably certain that the government or SBITA vendor will not exercise that option).

Under this Statement, a government generally should recognize a right-to-use subscription asset – an intangible asset – and a corresponding subscription liability. A government should recognize the subscription liability at the commencement of the subscription term, – which is when the subscription asset is placed into service. The subscription liability should be initially measured at the present value of subscription payments expected to be made during the subscription term. Future subscription payments should be discounted using the interest rate the SBITA vendor charges the government, which may be implicit, or the government's incremental borrowing rate if the interest rate is not readily determinable. A government should recognize amortization of the discount on the subscription liability as an outflow of resources (for example, interest expense) in subsequent financial reporting periods.

The subscription asset should be initially measured as the sum of (1) the initial subscription liability amount, (2) payments made to the SBITA vendor before commencement of the subscription term, and (3) capitalizable implementation costs, less any incentives received from the SBITA vendor at or before the commencement of the subscription term. A government should recognize amortization of the subscription asset as an outflow of resources over the subscription term.

Activities associated with a SBITA, other than making subscription payments, should be grouped into the following three stages, and their costs should be accounted for accordingly:

- Preliminary Project Stage, including activities such as evaluating alternatives, determining needed technology, and selecting a SBITA vendor. Outlays in this stage should be expensed as incurred.
- Initial Implementation Stage, including all ancillary charges necessary to place the subscription asset into service. Outlays in this stage generally should be capitalized as an addition to the subscription asset.
- Operation and Additional Implementation Stage, including activities such as subsequent implementation activities, maintenance, and other activities for a government's ongoing operations related to a SBITA. Outlays in this stage should be expensed as incurred unless they meet specific capitalization criteria.

In classifying certain outlays into the appropriate stage, the nature of the activity should be the determining factor. Training costs should be expensed as incurred, regardless of the stage in which they are incurred.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 96 – Subscription-Based Information Technology Arrangements (Continued)

If a SBITA contract contains multiple components, a government should account for each component as a separate SBITA or nonsubscription component and allocate the contract price to the different components. If it is not practicable to determine a best estimate for price allocation for some or all components in the contract, a government should account for those components as a single SBITA.

This Statement provides an exception for short-term SBITAs. Short-term SBITAs have a maximum possible term under the SBITA contract of 12 months (or less), including any options to extend, regardless of their probability of being exercised. Subscription payments for short-term SBITAs should be recognized as outflows of resources.

This Statement requires a government to disclose descriptive information about its SBITAs other than short-term SBITAs, such as the amount of the subscription asset, accumulated amortization, other payments not included in the measurement of a subscription liability, principal and interest requirements for the subscription liability, and other essential information.

GASB Statement No. 96 is effective for reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2022. Earlier application is encouraged.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 100 – Accounting Changes and Error Corrections – an Amendment of GASB Statement No. 62

The primary objective of this Statement is to enhance accounting and financial reporting requirements for accounting changes and error corrections to provide more understandable, reliable, relevant, consistent, and comparable information for making decisions or assessing accountability.

This Statement defines accounting changes as changes in accounting principles, changes in accounting estimates, and changes to or within the financial reporting entity and describes the transactions or other events that constitute those changes. As part of those descriptions, for (1) certain changes in accounting principles and (2) certain changes in accounting estimates that result from a change in measurement methodology, a new principle or methodology should be justified on the basis that it is preferable to the principle or methodology used before the change. That preferability should be based on the qualitative characteristics of financial reporting – understandability, reliability, relevance, timeliness, consistency, and comparability. This Statement also addresses corrections of errors in previously issued financial statements.

This Statement prescribes the accounting and financial reporting for (1) each type of accounting change and (2) error corrections. This Statement requires that (a) changes in accounting principles and error corrections be reported retroactively by restating prior periods, (b) changes to or within the financial reporting entity be reported by adjusting beginning balances of the current period, and (c) changes in accounting estimates be reported prospectively by recognizing the change in the current period. The requirements of this Statement for changes in accounting principles apply to the implementation of a new pronouncement in absence of specific transition provisions in the new pronouncement.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 100 – Accounting Changes and Error Corrections – an Amendment of GASB Statement No. 62 (Continued)

This Statement also requires that the aggregate amount of adjustments to and restatements of beginning net position, fund balance, or fund net position, as applicable, be displayed by reporting unit in the financial statements.

This Statement requires disclosure in notes to financial statements of descriptive information about accounting changes and error corrections, such as their nature. In addition, information about the quantitative effects on beginning balances of each accounting change and error correction should be disclosed by reporting unit in a tabular format to reconcile beginning balances as previously reported to beginning balances as restated.

Furthermore, this Statement addresses how information that is affected by a change in accounting principle or error correction should be presented in required supplementary information (RSI) and supplementary information (SI). For periods that are earlier than those included in the basic financial statements, information presented in RSI or SI should be restated for error corrections, if practicable, but not for changes in accounting principles.

GASB Statement No. 100 is effective for reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2023. Earlier application is encouraged.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 101 – Compensated Absences

The objective of this Statement is to better meet the information needs of financial statement users by updating the recognition and measurement guidance for compensated absences. That objective is achieved by aligning the recognition and measurement guidance under a unified model and by amending certain previously required disclosures.

This Statement requires that liabilities for compensated absences be recognized for (1) leave that has not been used and (2) leave that has been used but not yet paid in cash or settled through noncash means. A liability should be recognized for leave that has not been used if (a) the leave is attributable to services already rendered, (b) the leave accumulates, and (c) the leave is more likely than not to be used for time off or otherwise paid in cash or settled through noncash means. Leave is attributable to services already rendered when an employee has performed the services required to earn the leave. Leave that accumulates is carried forward from the reporting period in which it is earned to a future reporting period during which it may be used for time off or otherwise paid or settled. In estimating the leave that is more likely than not to be used or otherwise paid or settled, a government should consider relevant factors such as employment policies related to compensated absences and historical information about the use or payment of compensated absences. However, leave that is more likely than not to be settled through conversion to defined benefit postemployment benefits should not be included in a liability for compensated absences.

Accounting Standard Update – GASB Statement No. 101 – Compensated Absences (Continued)

This Statement requires that a liability for certain types of compensated absences – including parental leave, military leave, and jury duty leave – not be recognized until the leave commences. This Statement also requires that a liability for specific types of compensated absences not be recognized until the leave is used.

This Statement also establishes guidance for measuring a liability for leave that has not been used, generally using an employee's pay rate as of the date of the financial statements. A liability for leave that has been used but not yet paid or settled should be measured at the amount of the cash payment or noncash settlement to be made. Certain salary-related payments that are directly and incrementally associated with payments for leave also should be included in the measurement of the liabilities.

With respect to financial statements prepared using the current financial resources measurement focus, this Statement requires that expenditures be recognized for the amount that normally would be liquidated with expendable available financial resources.

This Statement amends the existing requirement to disclose the gross increases and decreases in a liability for compensated absences to allow governments to disclose only the net change in the liability (as long as they identify it as a net change). In addition, governments are no longer required to disclose which governmental funds typically have been used to liquidate the liability for compensated absences.

GASB Statement No. 101 is effective for reporting periods beginning after December 15, 2023. Earlier application is encouraged.

The City's response was not subjected to the other auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the response.

Purpose of this Report

This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the City's internal control and compliance. The City will thoroughly review activity throughout the year and ensure all necessary adjustments to financial data are recorded.

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The minutes of the Fairmont City Council meeting held on Monday, June 12, 2023, at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor Lee Baarts called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council Members Wayne Hasek, Britney Kawecki, Randy Lubenow, Jay Maynard and Michele Miller were present. Also in attendance: Finance Director Paul Hoye, Director of Public Works/Utilities Matthew York, City Clerk Patricia Monsen, Police Chief Mike Hunter, Civil Engineer Tyler Cowing and City Attorney Cara Brown.

Mayor Baarts advised council that item 6.C.3 Request for Demolition Assistance by Michael Munsterman would be pulled from the agenda for further review and clarification.

Council Member Lubenow made a motion to pull item 6.C.1 Tobacco License and Sale of Edible Products Infused with Tetrahydrocannabinol License for Fairmont Smoke Shop and place it under new business for discussion. Council Member Kawecki seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Hasek, Kawecki, Lubenow, Maynard and Miller voted aye. No one voted nay. Mayor Baarts declared said motion passed.

Council Member Kawecki made a motion to add a bi-weekly discussion item to the agenda for updates on the city administrator and interim search. Council Member Lubenow seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Kawecki made a motion to add discussion regarding the council's decision to restrict the ability for council members to add items to the agenda. Council Member Lubenow seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Kawecki and Lubenow voted aye. Council Members Maynard, Miller and Hasek voted nay. Mayor Baarts declared said motion failed.

Council Member Miller made a motion to table item 9.4 Proposed Financing Structure of the Community Center based on lack of city involvement designing the facility, lack of a concrete agreement that the Fairmont Area Community Center Association is responsible for maintenance and upkeep for building and property so property taxes are not increased to fund all due to rushed work sessions so the Fairmont Area Community Center Association can secure outside funding when the city hasn't done this for other non-profit organizations in the community and especially when the city should be spending more time focusing on replacing the city administrator position. Council Member Hasek seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Miller and Hasek voted aye. Council Members Lubenow, Maynard and Kawecki voted nay. Mayor Baarts declared said motion failed.

Council Member Lubenow made a motion to approve the agenda with the removal of Item 6.C.3 Request for Demolition Assistance by Michael Munsterman, moving Item 6.C.1 Tobacco License and Sale of Edible Products Infused with Tetrahydrocannabinol License for Fairmont Smoke Shop to new business number 9.6, the addition of Item 10.1 Update on Hiring of the City Administrator and Interim Administrator. Council Member Maynard seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Lubenow, Maynard, Hasek and Kawecki voted aye. Council Member Miller voted nay. Mayor Baarts declared said motion passed.

Mayor Baarts thanked the Interlaken Heritage Days committee for all their hard work. He thanked the Fire Department for their response to the library fire today. Mayor Baarts announced all the events happening in the city for the next two weeks.

Mayor Baarts recognized Representative Bjorn Olson and Senator Rich Draheim for helping the city receive authorization from the Legislature to bring a proposed Local Option Sales Tax to the voters.

Finance Director Paul Hoye presented the 2022 Aquatic Park Annual Report. Hoye thanked Betsy Steuber and the aquatic park staff for taking such good care of the park.

During Open Discussion, David Wing, representing Congressman Brad Finstad's office addressed the council and gave an update on affordable housing and the city's wastewater treatment facility project.

City resident Greg Zierke complained about the potholes in the city streets.

Council Member Miller made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Council Member Hasek seconded the motion and the motion carried. Items on the consent agenda were: Minutes from the May 22, 2023 City Council meeting; Transient Merchant Permit for TNT Fireworks to sell fireworks in the Walmart parking lot; Request for Funding for the July 4th fireworks by Light, Noise and Smoke of Fairmont; Fireworks Display Permit for J & M Displays for July 1, 2023; Application for a Premises Gambling Permit for Charitable Gambling at the Bowlmor Lanes; Transient Merchant Permit for Jordan Carr to sell fireworks in the Loxley Coffee parking lot; and Purchase Order 14739 for the repair of storm sewer on Hall Street.

Council Member Kawecki made a motion to approve **Resolution 2023-20**, a resolution regarding the administration of the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act. Council Member Maynard seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Maynard made a motion to approve the Maintenance and Operations Grant for SFY 24-25 and **Resolution 2023-23**. Council Member Miller seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Hasek made a motion to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with Fairmont Area Schools regarding a School Resource Officer Partnership. Council Member Miller seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Council Member Kawecki made a motion to adopt **Resolution 2023-21**, approving the proposed financing structure of the community center. Council Member Lubenow seconded the motion. On roll call: Council Members Kawecki, Lubenow and Maynard voted aye. Council Members Hasek and Miller voted nay. Mayor Baarts declared said motion passed.

Council Member Lubenow made a motion to temporarily amend the City Council Rules of Procedure adopted October 24, 2022 to designate Finance Director Paul Hoye and City Clerk Patricia Monsen to forward questions and concerns to the City Attorney until an Interim City Administrator or City Administrator is hired. Council Member Kawecki seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Council Member Maynard made a motion to approve the license for the sale of edible products infused with tetrahydrocannabinol and tobacco by Sammy Sarameh, d/b/a Fairmont Smoke Shop. Council Member Miller seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mayor Baarts and Councilor Miller gave the council an update on the hiring process of a new city administrator and interim city administrator. A community survey will be posted on the city's website in English and Spanish for community input.

Public Works/Utilities Director York thanked the city for allowing him to come. He reported that a dry shaft went down at the Water Department, but that it would be repaired by the end of the week. Tomorrow is city wide cleanup. There is a project on Lair Road which will close the road on Wednesday and Thursday from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. The City has been working with SMMPA on a transformer project and are in the final stages. He will be brining before the council some jurisdictional changes in the near future. The Electrical Department has been trying to get electricity to a campground at the corner of 230th Avenue and 120th Street. The city has now obtained a permit with MnDOT to go under I-90. The band shell is in the final phase of drawings for the project, and it is expected to go out for bids in July. He has been busy working on a state bond for the proposed community center and will have that paperwork into the state legislature by the end of the week. York also gave an update on the repair of potholes.

Councilor Hasek reported that the Board of Zoning Appeals approved two projects which came before them.

Councilor Kawecki reported that the Planning Commission heard plans for industrial storage sheds which are "purchase to own" and are proposed to be built on the south side of Lake Avenue.

Councilor Lubenow stated that the HRA did not have a quorum. He stated that he will be volunteering to help with the city clean up, so if citizens need help, they may contact him.

Councilor Maynard reported that FEDA approved five more façade forgivable loans. They reviewed deed restriction on some land by Center Creek for a proposed new business. He also stated that there is now a contractor committed to building the twin homes in Whitetail Ridge.

Councilor Miller stated that Visit Fairmont just reviewed and discussed visitor guides and some drone photography. She also shared CER classes beginning in June and July.

A motion was made by Council Member Maynard, seconded by Council Member Hasek and carried to adjourn the meeting at 6:34 p.m.

The city's Greencorps member will be working with park and engineering staff to complete these efforts in 2023 and 2024. **Budget Impact**: \$4600 which is reimbursable upon completion of grant agreement requirements. **Attachments**: Grant Agreement Council Action:

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STATE OF MINNESOTA GRANT CONTRACT AGREEMENT

This grant contract agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, MN 55155 ("STATE") and City of Fairmont, 100 Downtown Plaza, Fairmont, MN 56031 ("GRANTEE").

Recitals

- 1. Under Minn. Stat. §84.026, §84.085, Subd. 1, and Minnesota Session Laws 2021, 1st Special Session, Chapter 6, Article 1, Sec. 3, Subd. 4 (j) the State is empowered to enter into this grant contract agreement.
- 2. The State is in need of Urban and Community Forestry Services for the Preparing for Emerald Ash Borer project.
- 3. The Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this grant contract agreement to the satisfaction of the State. Pursuant to Minn.Stat.§16B.98, Subd.1, the Grantee agrees to minimize administrative costs as a condition of this grant contract agreement.

Grant Contract Agreement

1 Term of Grant Contract Agreement

1.1 Effective date:

July 1, 2023, Per Minn. Stat. §16B.98, Subd. 5, the Grantee must not begin work until this grant contract agreement is fully executed and the State's Authorized Representative has notified the Grantee that work may commence. Per Minn. Stat. §16B.98 Subd. 7, no payments will be made to the Grantee until this grant contract agreement is fully executed.

1.2 Expiration date:

June 30, 2025, or until all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first.

1.3 Survival of Terms.

The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this grant contract agreement: 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 12. Publicity and Endorsement; 13. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; and 15 Data Disclosure.

2 Grantee's Duties

The Grantee, who is not a state employee, will:

Comply with required grants management policies and procedures set forth through Minn.Stat.§16B.97, Subd. 4 (a) (1).

Perform the duties specified in Exhibit A and Exhibit B which are incorporated and made a part of this agreement.

3 Time

The Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this grant contract agreement. In the performance of this grant contract agreement, time is of the essence.

4 Consideration and Payment

4.1 Consideration.

The State will pay for all services performed by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement as follows:

(a) Compensation

The Grantee will be paid in an amount not to exceed \$4,600.00 on a reimbursement basis for qualifying purchases. The Grantee shall submit payment requests with required expenditure documentation.

According to the breakdown of costs contained in Exhibit B, which is attached and incorporated into this grant contract, the Grantee certifies that a minimum 0% matching requirement for the grant will be met by the City of Fairmont. The total project cost is \$6,900.00. Grantee agrees to match at least \$2,300.00 of this project cost.

(b) Travel Expenses

Reimbursement for travel and subsistence expenses actually and necessarily incurred by the Grantee as a result of this grant contract agreement will not exceed \$0.00; provided that the Grantee will be reimbursed for travel and subsistence expenses in the same manner and in no greater amount than provided in the current "Commissioner's Plan" promulgated by the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB). The Grantee will not be reimbursed for travel and subsistence expenses incurred outside Minnesota unless it has received the State's prior written approval for out of state travel. Minnesota will be considered the home state for determining whether travel is out of state.

(c) Total Obligation.

The total obligation of the State for all compensation and reimbursements to the Grantee under this grant contract agreement will not exceed \$4,600.00.

4.2 Payment

(a) Invoices

The State will promptly pay the Grantee after the Grantee presents an itemized invoice for the services actually performed and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services. Invoices must be submitted timely and according to the following schedule:

- 1. January 8, 2024
- 2. July 1, 2024
- 3. January 6, 2025
- 4. June 30, 2025

The State shall disburse funds to the Grantee pursuant to this agreement on a reimbursement basis. The Grantee shall submit payment requests with required expenditure documentation. All project work must be completed and the final request for reimbursement (along with final reports) must be submitted by June 30,2025.

(b) Unexpended Funds

The Grantee must promptly return to the State any unexpended funds that have not been accounted for annually in a financial report to the State due at grant closeout.

4.3 Contracting and Bidding Requirements

Per Minn. Stat. §471.345, grantees that are municipalities as defined in Subd. 1 must follow the law.

- (a) For projects that include construction work of \$25,000 or more, prevailing wage rules apply per Minn. Stat. §\$177.41 through 177.44. These rules require that the wages of laborers and workers should be comparable to wages paid for similar work in the community as a whole.
- (b) The grantee must not contract with vendors who are suspended or debarred in MN: http://www.mmd.admin.state.mn.us/debarredreport.asp

5 Conditions of Payment

All services provided by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

6 Authorized Representative

The State's Authorized Representative is Emma Schultz, Community Forest Project Specialist, 500 Lafayette Rd., St. Paul, MN 55155, 651-259-5274, ucf.dnr@state.mn.us, or his/her successor, and has the

responsibility to monitor the Grantee's performance and the authority to accept the services provided under this grant contract agreement. If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

The Grantee's Authorized Representative is Tyler Cowing, Civil Engineer, 100 Downtown Plaza, Fairmont, MN 56031, (507) 238-3948, towing@fairmont.org. If the Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this grant contract agreement, the Grantee must immediately notify the State.

7 Assignment Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Contract Agreement Complete

7.1 Assignment

The Grantee shall neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this grant contract agreement without the prior written consent of the State, approved by the same parties who executed and approved this grant contract agreement, or their successors in office.

7.2 Amendments

Any amendments to this grant contract agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant contract, or their successors in office.

7.3 Waiver

If the State fails to enforce any provision of this grant contract agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to enforce it.

7.4 Grant Contract Agreement Complete

This grant contract agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and the Grantee. No other understanding regarding this grant contract, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8 Liability

The Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this grant contract agreement by the Grantee or the Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this grant contract agreement.

9 State Audits

Under Minn. Stat. § 16B.98, Subd.8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of the Grantee or other party relevant to this grant contract agreement or transaction are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this grant contract agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention requirements, whichever is later.

10 Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property Rights

10.1 Government Data Practices

The Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant contract, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Grantee or the State. If the Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this Clause, the Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give the Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. The Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law

10.2 Intellectual Property Rights

The State owns all rights, title, and interest in all of the intellectual property rights, including copyrights, patents, trade secrets, trademarks, and service marks in the Works and Documents created

and paid for under this contract. If intellectual property rights are identified, the grantee must contact the DNR immediately.

11 Workers Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. §176.181, Subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

12 Publicity and Endorsement

12.1 Publicity

Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this grant contract agreement must identify the State as the sponsoring agency and must not be released without prior written approval from the State's Authorized Representative. For purposes of this provision, publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Grantee individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors, with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this grant contract. All projects primarily funded by state grant appropriations must publicly credit the State of Minnesota, including on the grantee's website when practicable.

12.2 Endorsement

The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

13 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this grant contract agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this grant contract agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14 Termination

14.1 Termination by the State

The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.

14.2 Termination for Cause

The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this grant contract, that reasonable progress has not been made or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.

14.3 Termination for Insufficient Funding

The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement if:

- (a) It does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature
- (b) Or, if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the grant contract agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State must provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.

14.4 Additional Alternate Termination Language

Additional alternate termination language may be negotiated on a case-by-case basis after the state

agency has consulted with their legal and finance teams.

15 Data Disclosure

Under Minn. Stat. § 270C.65, Subd. 3, and other applicable law, the Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

Project Overview and Need

The City of Fairmont is requesting funding for a city-wide tree inventory project to detect ash trees which may be infected with the Emerald Ash Borer, to map healthy ash trees, and to inventory other tree species so we can ensure future plantings are diverse.

 We will use the funding to purchase GPS equipment to map all trees on public land within city limits, and each data point will be associated with the species of tree and the status of EAB infection.

We intend to host a GreenCorps member or city-funded Intern who will be working on this project. This project will include public land within the City's Environmental Justice Area (See Environmental Justice Map). This person will work in conjunction with staff members who are certified by the DNR to detect and pinpoint EAB infected trees. This data will be used in a future project to remove and replace unhealthy ash trees with a diverse population of young and healthy tree species. Data will be supplied to the DNR via shapefiles. Without the funding for the GPS equipment we will not be able to complete an accurate tree inventory. Although the number of ash trees in our city is currently unknown, all of our public areas have trees, and most have mature ash trees, as they were a common planting at one time. Our citizens use our parks, trails, and shorelines frequently for recreation in all seasons. (Please See Attached City Parks Map, Bike Trails Map, and Snowmobile Trail map) The hazards of dead or diseased ash trees include falling branches and, in some cases, falling trees, which could result in injury and

possible death, especially in winter with increased snow load on EAB infected trees. In addition, removing diseased and dead ash trees will slow the infection rate, and help stymie the spread of EAB overall in our city.

Project Timeline

Through this funding we plan to gain the knowledge of what species of trees are in our public spaces, how many are Ash trees, and how many Ash trees are infested, along with their locations. At the end of this project, we will have a complete, interactive, GIS map of all the trees on Public Property, along with the locations of all Ash trees and the locations of EAB infestations. We intend on prioritizing Boulevards, then moving to Parks and other Public Areas, with an emphasis on our EJ areas. After the funding from this grant has ended, we fully intend on furthering the project by analyzing the collected data of our current tree inventory. Once we know the species that exist, where they are located and if they are currently infested with EAB we will develop plans for a city-wide tree replacement which may include additional plantings to what was originally there. This is expected to be continued and accomplished by a GreenCorps Member or city-funded Intern in the coming years.

- Fall 2023- GIStree data collection begins on Boulevards.
- Winter 2023- EAB management plan is developed. Data collected thus far is imported and mapped in GIS. Spring/summer 2024- GIS tree data collection begins on Parks and Public Areas.
- Late summer 2024- Data Collection will be completed. All data collected during this project will be imported, attributed, and mapped.

Project Budget Explanation

The City of Fairmont is leveraging support through hosting a GreenCorps member or city-funded Intern at our site to help with this project, which will save additional costs over using a hired contractor, as well as extending additional support, experience, and training to a young environmental professional. If a GreenCorps member is not secured at our location we can use a city funded Intern to complete this work.

- The City is asking for \$4,600 for GPS equipment for data collection.
- \$1800 for mileage and vehicle expense (\$20.57/day for 87 days) would be provided as an In-Kind Match. In addition, we would provide \$500 as an In-Kind Match for any office supplies the GreenCorps Member or city funded intern might need to perform their job.

Project Impacts on Priority Landscapes and Populations

The City of Fairmont has a significant portion of its population in an Environmental Justice area, as shown on the attached map.

 We plan on educating this area on EAB infestations using flyers and doorhangers, as well as other general public outreach conducted by the chosen GreenCorps member or City funded Intern.

The majority of our EJ area is an older part of the community which has been around for some time. This area has larger trees with thicker canopies and larger limbs. If these trees are infested with EAB and they fall or shed branches there is a much larger potential for damage to personal property, and infrastructure damage. These trees could also cause injures and possible death. The EJ area in our community is considered a low-income area, and these citizens are less likely to be able to finance a repair on a home due to a large falling branch, or fully pay a medical bill due to injury by a falling tree. In addition, these citizens likely don't have the flexibility to take the time off of work to manage problems

due to fallen diseased trees. The costs of such damage, whether it is property or injury will be substantial. It is imperative that the EAB situation is addressed in our EJ areas in particular.

Communication

The City of Fairmont plans to use a variety resources to engage with the public about the EAB project if awarded.

The city would use its social media pages, website, local newspaper, updates during city council
meetings, and utility billing stuffers to inform about the project and how completing a tree
inventory and EAB management plan will help the city manage its urban forest, and help budget
for EAB related costs.

Key Personnel

- Chad Striemer, Bachelor of Science City Forester UMN MN Tree Inspector Certification. Chad has worked as the City Forester for 24 years and has a great understanding of the EAB situation in our city, as well as having a great background in urban forestry. In addition, he has his tree inspector's liscense through the MN DNR.
- Nick Lardy, Parks Department Superintendent UMN MN Tree Inspector Certification. Nick has
 worked as the Parks Department and Street Department Superintendent for 9 years, and has
 taken on many large projects during his time with the city, and knows the city very well. In
 addition, he has his tree inspector's liscense through the MN DNR.
- Tyler Cowing, Civil Engineer B.S. Atmospheric Sciences, M.S. Water Resources- Civil
 Engineering. Tyler has worked in the City Engineering Department for 11 years. during his time
 with the City he has worked on several construction projects which involve urban forestry.
 Street reconstruction projects and City Park renovations are a couple examples of these
 projects. He also has a good understanding of trees and their benefits due to his work with the
 City's Stormwater Management Program.

Tree Planting

Grant funds will not fund the purchase of trees that are over-represented in your community. Any genera that comprise 10% or more of the community forest make-up will not be funded. Numbers derived from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources 2010 Rapid Assessment will be used unless an updated inventory is provided. For your community this means grant funds cannot be spent on purchasing:

Acer (maple): 28.7%
Fraxinus (ash): 21.4%
Picea (spruce): 17.4%

All trees planted with grant funds are expected to be maintained based on the City of Fairmont's Three Year Tree Maintenance Plan submitted as Exhibit C. Trees that do not survive will need to be replaced prior to grant close-out utilizing the warranty the city has with the nursery that stock was purchased from, or at the expense of the City of Fairmont.

Requesting Reimbursement

Accomplishment reports and maps of completed work will be submitted with all requests for reimbursement.

- Partial payment form along with invoices and proof of payment for grant-funded purchases,
 Cash Match form along with proof of payment, and In-Kind Match form
- Partial payments may be submitted as needed and must include all up-to-date required documents and accomplishment reports, including a relevant certification and/or declaration
- Accomplishment reports will include grant contract deliverables and their impacts
- Photo documentation of the project's progress at appropriate phases, and illustrations, diagrams, charts, graphs, and maps to show results
- Maps will:
 - o Identify the location of ash that have been removed
 - o Identify the location of ash stumps that have been ground
 - o Identify the location and species of trees that have been planted
 - Identify the location of ash trees that have been treated
- All trees removed, treated, and planted will be mapped and submitted as shapefiles, with the
 planted trees identified by species and size, to obtain grand fund reimbursement. If your
 community does not have access to shapefile-generating software, please notify your DNR
 Urban and Community Forestry Team Member, and they will work to assist you.

Following the submission of invoices and accomplishment reports, a compliance check will be conducted by Minnesota Department of Natural Resources staff. Staff will do a site evaluation ensuring that tree species submitted on maps are correctly identified and planted in accordance with the standards set in the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Pocket Guide to Planting Trees.

Staff will also ensure that the project adheres to the 20-10-5 guideline which means that following planting, a community has no more than 20% of their trees within a single family, no more than 10% of their trees within a single genus, and no more than 5% of their trees within a single species. Staff will confirm that planted tree stock is $\frac{3}{4}$ caliper bareroot or a container class size #20 or smaller.

Ineligible Project Expenses

Ineligible project expenses include, but are not limited to:

- Costs incurred prior to the start date on the fully executed grant agreement
- Staff time for local government unit employees
- Purchase of trees listed on the <u>Minnesota Invasive Terrestrial Plants</u> and <u>Minnesota Noxious</u>
 <u>Weed</u> lists, including Amur cork tree, Amur maple, autumn olive, black locust, buckthorn, Callery pear, Norway maple, Russian olive, Siberian elm, Tatarian maple, and tree of heaven
- Purchase of balled and burlapped trees, containerized trees larger than #20, and bareroot trees greater than 2" caliper diameter
- Purchase of tree species that already make up 10% or more of the community's public trees, or whose family makes up 20% or more of the public trees
- Purchase of plants such as shrubs, living ground covers, sod, grass seed, and flowers
- Purchase of land or easements
- Major soil and grade changes or construction
- Equipment purchases equal to or exceeding \$5,000
- Purchase of meals or snacks for volunteers
- Experimental practices not approved by DNR

Overview:	

On November 14, 2022, the City of Fairmont entered into a Master Agreement for Professional Services with Bolton & Menk. This Master Agreement was initiated due to the City Engineer position being vacated.

On May 18, 2023, former City Administrator, Cathy Reynolds, received a letter from Bolton & Menk discussing the Gomsrud channel wall and more directly the Gabion Baskets in the middle of the channel. The letter is attached to this agenda item, but the highlights are as follows:

- 1) There are failing portions on the West Side of the channel where rocks are failing out the gabion baskets.
- 2) They were initially installed in the 1990s.
- 3) Portions of the gabion basket wall have already been removed, and sheet piling has been put in their place.
- 4) The wall cannot be repaired with gabion baskets.

The conclusion and recommendations section states that the gabion baskets need to be removed and replaced with sheet pile walls designed to last 75+ years instead of 25-30 years in the gabion baskets. Cost is estimated at \$300-335,000 with an additional \$100,000 in removal and other expenses.

Budget Impact:

In the 2023 Capital Improvement Plan, the City has appropriated \$1,375,000 for the phase 1 projects at Gomsrud park. The cost of this project would be utilized out of those funds, and additional monies will be requested in 2024 to complete the project.

This project will delay the Gomsrud Park Project. This is due to the equipment needed to complete the project and wanting to avoid damaging the newly laid parking lots.

GOMSRUD CHANNEL WALL REPAIRS

CITY OF FAIRMONT, MINNESOTA

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AND SCOPE OF IMPROVEMENTS

The CONSULTANT agrees to provide civil design engineering services required for the construction of the Gomsrud Channel Wall Repairs. The work is proposed on the west side of the existing channel to repair the failing gabion baskets and to prevent further movement of the existing structure.

The basic improvements anticipated as part of this Agreement include:

Construction of a steel sheet pile wall along the west side of the existing channel. The new wall would begin at the corner of the existing sheet pile on the north end of the channel and run approximately 350 feet south where it would match into the existing bridge abutment. It is anticipated that the wall would be constructed of galvanized steel with a pile cap to match the existing wall on the north end of the channel. The alignment would begin east of the existing gabion baskets on the north end and then cross-over and run west of the baskets for most of the project length. The existing gabion baskets would be removed and disposed of after the new sheet pile wall is installed. It is assumed that the channel will not need to be drained but will require intermittent closures to accommodate construction. Removing the existing gabion baskets from the west side of the channel is anticipated to be the most cost-effective alternative. Currently, the city does not have direct access to the west side of the channel and will need to assist in coordination of temporary access to the proposed construction area.

I.A. BASIC SERVICES

For purposes of this Project, Basic Services to be provided by the CONSULTANT are as follows:

Task 1: Project Administration and Coordination

CONSULTANT will meet with CLIENT to review available information relative to the project, confirm CLIENT design standards for the project, and verify the project scope & schedule.

CONSULTANT will offer regular updates on next steps and upcoming project requirements.

CONSULTANT will also prepare and provide miscellaneous project correspondence, scheduling, invoicing, and budget management necessary for expediting work products and project decision-making. Schedule updates will be provided on a regular basis.

Task 2: Field Data Collection

CONSULTANT will complete a topographic survey to provide base mapping, a digital terrain model, and utility information within the project site. Utility coordination will be completed to include private utility information on the topographic survey. CLIENT will provide documentation for boundary lines and right-of-way to be identified and accurately represented on the plans.

Task 3: Final Design and Construction Plans

CONSULTANT will perform structural calculations for the proposed sheet pile wall structure and prepare detailed construction plans for the proposed improvements. This includes preparation of applicable plan sections including:

- Title Sheet, Existing Conditions and Utilities
- Removal Plan
- Site Layout and Wall Alignment
- Site and Structural Details
- Statement of Estimated Quantities
- SWPPP/Erosion Control Plan
- Site Restoration and Turf Establishment Plan

CONSULTANT will prepare an engineer's cost estimate based on the final plans. CONSULTANT will prepare permit applications associated with the improvements and submit them for approval. The permit application fees will be the responsibility of the CLIENT. The following applications may be required:

- City of Fairmont Land Disturbance Permit
- Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Public Waters Work Permit

Task 4: Bidding Services

The CONSULTANT will prepare a complete project manual to include specifications and contract documents. CONSULTANT will prepare and publish the advertisement for bid and distribute the bid documents. CONSULTANT will provide responses to questions from contractors and issue addenda as required. CONSULTANT will attend the bid opening, prepare the resultant bid tabulation, and provide verification of submitted bids to CLIENT. CONSULTANT will prepare a contract award recommendation letter and attend the council meeting in which awarding of the contract is anticipated. CONSULTANT will distribute the contract to the selected contractor and secure the required contractor submittals necessary to commence construction.

Construction Engineering Services

CONSULTANT proposes an estimated hourly fee for construction-related services. CONSULTANT will provide a proposal with construction fee and summary of these services after bids are received to provide a well-defined scope and schedule. Construction services are not included within this agreement.

Gabion Retaining Wall Opinion

Dear Cathy,

Below is an opinion summary based upon our review of the existing gabion retaining wall and the information provided.

I. BACKGROUND

Bolton & Menk, Inc. (BMI) has reviewed the condition of the existing gabion style retaining wall for the channel near Gomsrud park in Fairmont, MN. The conditions were noted by others to be in the process of failing with reports of rocks falling out of gabion baskets and towards the middle of the channel. The failing portion of the wall is on the west side of the channel. The east side appears to be mostly intact at the moment. The wall on the west side of the channel was built in the 1990's and a steel sheet pile wall was later added at the north and south ends.

II. DESCRIPTION OF WALL CONDITION

The main construction of the channel retaining wall is a gabion basket style wall. The baskets are constructed with galvanized steel wire and each basket is filled with rocks. The baskets get wider as they go down in elevation into the channel. There is evidence that the top of wall has moved in towards the middle of the channel and the soil behind the wall has moved with the top of wall. This is evident by the observed openings/cracks in the soil in some locations and the leaning appearance along the full length of the wall. It is not known how far the wall has moved from its original position, but it will continue to move until remediation measures are taken.

There is some visible damage to the wire that makes up the baskets and this appears to be caused by corrosion. This may be due to the proximity of a parking lot and the winter snow possibly containing salt that piles up near the wall when the lot is cleared. The openings in the wire baskets have allowed rocks to fall out of the baskets and into the channel which will accelerate the deterioration of the wall and will also cause issues with boat traffic in the channel.

III. CONCLUSION/RECOMMENDATIONS

The condition of the gabion wall on the west side of the channel is likely not repairable and would require the channel to be drained to fully evaluate or repair. That would only be a short-term

solution with the need for a complete replacement in the near future. While it is possible to replace the gabion wall with a new wall of the same style, this is likely not a viable option as it's not the most economical and beneficial solution for long term results. Replacement of the wall with a gabion style wall would likely require shutting down and completely draining the channel to provide access to remove and replace the wall. The relative life span (approx. 25-30 years) of this type of wall is shorter than other types of retaining walls.

It is recommended that the existing channel wall on the west side be replaced with a steel sheet pile wall. There are already existing portions of the wall that are now sheet pile (near the bridge and on the north end of the channel) that can be matched. It might be possible to install a sheet pile wall with little disturbance to the channel and reduced down time. The sheet pile wall could be installed behind the existing gabion wall in some areas and then the gabion baskets could be removed after the new wall is in place which would also widen the channel in this area. Alternatively, the sheet pile wall could be installed on the channel side of the existing gabion walls and that material could be left in place. This option would actually narrow the channel slightly and could create a transitional challenge at the bridge underpass. Access to the west side of the channel would be the most efficient way to remove the existing walls and install a new sheet pile wall. This would require access to private property lots and residential properties.


The sheet pile wall will be designed for a longer overall life span than the gabion style wall. Typically, we can design a sheet pile wall to get 75+ years of design life versus the 25-30 years of a submerged gabion wall. The estimated cost for a sheet pile wall would be about \$850-\$950 per foot of wall. At 350 feet the cost would be around \$300,000 - \$335,000 to install the sheet pile wall with some added costs estimated at \$100,000 to remove the existing wall. There may also be some additional costs for access to private property during construction and will likely require several permits from state and federal agencies.



To approve the plat, Council may adopt Resolution 2023-24. **Budget Impact**: Road and utility maintenance for any extension of South Armstrong Drive. APPROVAL OF THE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLAT OF THE FAIRMONT INDUSTRIAL PARK TWELFTH ADDITION

WHEREAS, Fairmont Growth Opportunities Corporation, a Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation, ("Applicant") has submitted an application for Preliminary Plat approval for the Fairmont Industrial Park Twelfth Addition, located at 700 Armstrong Drive S, Fairmont, MN 56031 and legally described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant is the owner of the above-described Property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Fairmont City Code, Section 24-77, preliminary plats shall be prepared by a surveyor and contain the following information:

- (1) Name of proposed plat, name and address of the owners, registered engineer or surveyor, and owners of the adjacent property.
- (2) Legal description of the property to be platted and small scale sketch showing location as described.
- (3) Date, approximate north point, and graphic scale (not less than one hundred (100) feet to one (1) inch).
- (4) Acreage of the land to be subdivided.
- (5) Zoning classification of land to be subdivided and all adjacent lands.
- (6) Contours at an interval of two (2) feet. If natural contours are to be changed more than two (2) feet a grading plan should be submitted showing approximate final elevations.
- (7) Boundary lines of area to be subdivided, their bearings and distances.
- (8) Existing and proposed easements and their locations, widths and distances.
- (9) Streets on and adjacent to the tract and their names, widths, proposed approximate grades and proposed relative ground elevations at the intersections of all streets and every one hundred (100) feet along such streets and at the corners or extremities of the plat, and other dimensions as may be required. Elevations shall be to city datum or if unavailable a bench mark for the plat shall be shown.
- (10) Utilities on and adjacent to the tract showing proposed connections to existing utility systems. Rear easements for utility poles and wires shall be provided wherever possible. Data to be provided includes type of utility; location of manholes, catch basins, hydrants, etc.; approximate depth of pipes, size of pipe and direction of flow.
- (11) Lot lines, lot numbers, lot dimensions and square footage of each lot.
- (12) Sites and their acreages, if any to be reserved or dedicated for parks, recreation areas, open spaces, schools or other public uses.
- (13) Minimum building setback lines.

- (14) Location of railroads, streams, natural and proposed drainage courses, permanent buildings, natural features, and other information.
- (15) Other reasonable information, such as percolation and other soil tests, if so requested by the city planner or planning commission.
- (16) Description of any proposed deed restrictions.
- (17) An informational statement as to the general plan of improvement, drainage, and development.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Fairmont City Code, Section 24-82(a), the final plat shall include the following information or any other information as required by state law:

- (1) Data required by state law to fully describe the land to be platted including accurate dimensions, angles, bearings to describe boundaries, streets, easements, areas reserved for public purpose and other important features (drawn not less than one hundred (100) feet to one (1) inch).
- (2) Name and right-of-way width of each street.
- (3) Block and lot numbers, lot dimensions and square footage.
- (4) Purpose for which sites, other than residential lots, are dedicated or reserved.
- (5) Location of rivers, streams, creeks, lakes and wetlands as required by state law.
- (6) Names and location of adjoining subdivisions, streets, right-of-ways, and any other sites for public use.
- (7) Certifications on the plats that are required by state law.
- (8) Dedication of streets, easements, public areas and right-of-ways.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Fairmont City Code, Section 24-82(b) the subdivider shall submit the following when filing the final plat unless exempted by the city planner:

- (1) Certification that the subdivider has complied with one (1) of the following alternatives:
 - a. Has installed and constructed basic improvements in the proposed subdivision in compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
 - b. Executed an agreement with the city council regarding the installation and construction of basic improvements in the proposed subdivision.
- (2) Cross-sections, profiles and grades of streets, curbs, gutters and sidewalks showing locations of in-street utilities; drawn to standard scales and elevations and prepared by a registered professional engineer.
- (3) Drainage and grading plan showing approximate final elevations at two-foot intervals.
- (4) Protective covenant documents.
- (5) Letters of approval of highway access points and service roads from the commissioner of highways and county engineer.
- (6) Title opinion by an attorney indicating ownership of the subdivision when public easements or right-of-ways are dedicated to the city.
- (7) Tax certification showing that all taxes and assessments due on the property

to be subdivided have been paid in full.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Fairmont City Code, Section 24-93(b), the Planning Commission shall consider the final plat and will not recommend the plat for approval unless it meets the following:

- (1) Conforms to the preliminary plat.
- (2) Conforms to design standards set forth in this chapter.
- (3) Conforms to the comprehensive plan.
- (4) Is in accordance with all requirements and laws of the state.

WHEREAS, the Fairmont Planning Commission considered the Applicant's request for a Preliminary Plat at a duly noticed Public Hearing, which took place on June 6, 2023, and recommended approval to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, a Development Agreement is required and shall be prepared between the City of Fairmont and Fairmont Growth Opportunities Corporation, which outlines the responsibilities of Fairmont Growth Opportunities Corporation to install the required street and infrastructure improvements necessary to support development on lots within the Fairmont Industrial Park Twelfth Addition subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fairmont has reviewed the Preliminary and Final Plat of the Fairmont Industrial Park Twelfth Addition for compliance with Fairmont City Code, and statutes of the State of Minnesota.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL THAT, the City Council hereby adopts the Findings of Fact of the Planning Commission and the Preliminary and Final Plat of the Fairmont Industrial Park Twelfth Addition are hereby approved, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The Preliminary and Final Plat shall comply with the provisions of all state statutes and standard procedures for platting in Martin County.
- 2. Prior to the City's execution of the Final Plat, the Applicant must enter into an agreement with the City for the installation of all required improvements, which shall be referred to as the "Development Agreement" and the Applicant shall provide the required security contained therein.
- 3. The requirements and conditions of the Development Agreement shall be incorporated as conditions of the City's execution of the Final Plat.
- 4. In accordance with Fairmont City Code, Section 24-93(d), the Final Plat shall be recorded by the subdivider within 90 days of approval or the City's approval shall be deemed null and void without further action by the City Council following the expiration of such period, unless a written request for extension has made by the Applicant stating the reasons

5. The Applicant shall pay all fees, including by not limited to recording fees.







Recommendation : The Planning Commission recommends approval of the PUD with conditions.
Overview: Midwest Shop Condos has applied for a Planned Unit Development (PUD) to build shop condominiums at I Block 1 of the Fairmont Industrial Park Twelfth Addition. The applicant proposes several buildings on the site. The buildings would be split into units and sold to individual owners under an overall governance structure pursuant to state statute for common interest developments. Allowable uses of the units would be any uses allowed in the underlying I-1 Light Industrial district; however most units are intended to be shops and storage for businesses and contractors.
The City's role in reviewing the proposal is to verify that the overall site design meets the purposes of the Comprehensi Plan and design standards set by City Code; and that the proposal would not be detrimental to the surrounding area or the community's orderly development.
The developer proposes an outlot for stormwater retention, intended to service both the development parcel and the future South Armstrong Drive extension to the south. Details relating to maintenance of the retention pond will be brought back to Council through a development agreement, which should be required as a condition of the PUD approval.
Staff believe the site layout is adequate for first-phase access and not dissimilar to other developments of the like. The Planning Commission discussed some concerns with the site layout and the ability for fire trucks to turn around. The Commission approved the PUD conditional upon the Fire Department providing to Council an opinion on the layout. The Fire Chief's comment is attached. If the site were to expand in the future as indicated on the PUD site plan, a second access would likely be needed to adequately handle increased traffic at the site.
More details for this PUD are located in the attached resolution. Staff recommend approval.
Budget Impact : Road and utility maintenance for any extension of South Armstrong Drive. Likely maintenance for the stormwater retention pond.

Findings of Fact

Fairmont City Code, Section 26-280, requires the review and evaluation of the PUD pursuant to, but not be limited to, the following criteria:

(1) Adequate property control is established and provided to protect the individual owner's rights and property values and to define legal responsibilities for maintenance and upkeep.

The applicant proposes a CIC declaration which will establish property control.

(2) The interior circulation plan plus access from and onto public rights-of-way does not create congestion or dangers and is adequate for the safety of the project residents and general public.

Planning and Engineering staff have reviewed the site layout and find it to be adequate for the safety of project residents and the public.

(3) A sufficient amount of usable open space is provided.

The proposed amount of open space is typical for industrial developments of this kind.

(4) The arrangement of buildings, structures and accessory uses does not unreasonably disturb the privacy or property values of the surrounding uses.

The arrangement of buildings, structures, and accessory uses will not unreasonably disturb the privacy or property values of the surrounding uses, which are similar industrial uses.

(5) The architectural design of the project is compatible with the surrounding area.

The architecture proposed is compatible with the surrounding industrial area.

(6) The drainage and utility system plans are submitted to the city engineer and are subject to his approval.

The applicant proposes to comply with this requirement.

(7) The development schedule insures a logical development of the site which will protect the public interest and concerned landowners.

The proposal divides the project into logical phases.

(8) Principal and accessory uses, and requirements are in compliance with the district provisions in which the development is intended.

The uses proposed by the PUD, as well as associated requirements, are all compliant with the I-1 Light Industrial district.

(9) The performance standards of this chapter are complied with.

The applicant proposes no features which would violate zoning performance standards.

(10) Planned unit developments in shoreland management areas meet regulations and requirements listed in article VII. Such developments shall be subject to review by the state department of natural resources.

The development is not located within the Shoreland Management District.

- (11) The provisions of article II, division 4 are considered and satisfactorily met.
 - a. Must be in conformance with the comprehensive plan.

Fairmont Forward: 2040 Comprehensive Plan visions a pattern of land use that provides "a purposeful balance of residential neighborhoods, commercial districts, and industrial areas". The proposed use meets this vision by providing a space for a number of light industrial uses to operate away from residences and commercial centers.

The Plan goes on to prioritize "efficient, effective, and sustainable" use of transportation and other public infrastructure. By locating the development off of the existing light industrial corridor of western Lake Avenue and by proposing the logical extension of Armstrong Avenue, the proposal meets the intent of this priority.

b. Must not be detrimental or injurious to the general vicinity and uses already permitted in the area.

The proposed use and intensity of the use are typical for the area. The use is surrounded by other light industrial uses and undeveloped farmland outside city limits.

c. Must not impede the normal and orderly development of surrounding vacant property.

By proposing that Armstrong Drive will extend to the south unimpeded and without any unorderly lot lines or stretches of inefficient right-of-way, the development meets this standard.


d. Must be served by adequate utilities, public roads, and municipal facilities. Such requirements shall not be detrimental to the economic welfare of the city.

The proposal would be served by the proper utilities extending with Armstrong Drive, and site drainage will be adequately managed per relevant engineering standards.

e. Must not cause offensive odors, fumes, dust, noise, or vibration that would be injurious or a nuisance to adjacent uses or the surrounding area.

The applicant does not propose any uses which would be injurious to the surrounding area. The uses allowable at this site are the same that are allowable in the underlying district.







The Contractor shall attach training documentation to this SWPPP for the Construction SWPPP Manager and BMP Installer prior to the start of construction. This information shall be kept up to date until the project NOT is filed.

ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION

Payment for all work associated with Erosion and Sediment Control shall be as described in the Project Manual. Unless otherwise authorized by the Owner no additional payment shall be made for any work required to administer and maintain the site erosion and sediment control in compliance with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) - General Stormwater Permit for Construction Activity (MN R100001) including but not limited to inspection, maintenance, and removal of BMPs or addition of BMPs to accommodate Contractor phasing.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

Permittees must make the SWPPP, including all inspection reports, maintenance records, training records and other information required by this permit, available to federal, state, and local officials within three (3) days upon request for the duration of the permit and for three (3) years following the NOT.

GENERAL STORMWATER DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

All requirements listed in Section 5.1 of the Permit for the design of the permanent stormwater management system and discharge have been included in the preparation of this SWPPP. These include but are not limited to:

- The expected amount, frequency, intensity, and duration of precipitation.
- The nature of stormwater runoff and run-on at the site
- Peak flow rates and stormwater volumes to minimize erosion at outlets and downstream channel and stream bank erosion.
- The range of soil particle sizes expected to be present on the site.


Construction activities include: Road construction, site grading, sanitary sewer and water main installation, pond excavation, storm sewer installation, temporary erosion and sediment control, and

Stormwater currently drains by overland flow on farmland in four general directions within the site. An existing tile system west of the site collects a large portion of the stormwater and other areas discharge to public right-of-way, a private site, and other adjacent farmland.

This project will be constructed in multiple phases and an overall stormwater management plan was developed in the full-build scenario. Most of the proposed drainage in the full-build scenario will be routed to the planned pond to treat the stormwater and attenuate the peak flow. The pond will ultimately discharge to the mentioned tile system west of the property

The listed impervious area with this project includes the currently proposed phase. The anticipated full-build impervious area is approximately 7.9 acres and the pond is sized for this.

A copy of the SWPPP must remain on site at all times. Any modifications to the SWPPP must be approved by the Engineer.

- 3. It is determined that the SWPPP is not achieving objectives of minimizing pollutants in stormwater discharges associated with construction activity, or
- 4. The SWPPP is not consistent with the terms and conditions of the permit.

The Contractor may implement SWPPP amendments immediately and is not required to wait for Engineer review of the submittal. The responsibility for completeness of SWPPP amendments and compliance with the Permit lies with the Contractor. Review, comment, or lack of comment by the Engineer on a SWPPP amendment shall not absolve the responsibilities of the Contractor in

If a change order is issued for a design change the SWPPP amendment will be prepared by the Engineer and included in the change order

In addition to SWPPP amendments, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer Weekly Erosion and Sediment Control Schedule meeting the requirements of MnDOT 1717.

The Contractor shall keep copies of all SWPPP amendments, Weekly Erosion and Sediment Control Schedules, inspection logs, and maintenance logs with the field copy of the SWPPP. A PDF copy of these documents will be provided along with a copy of the final Field Copy of the SWPPP to the Engineer along with the signed Notice of Termination when final stabilization is complete.

EROSION PREVENTION PRACTICES

Stormwater conveyance channels shall be routed around unstabilized areas. Erosion controls and velocity dissipation devices shall be used at outlets within and along the length of any constructed conveyance channel

The normal wetted perimeter of all ditches or swales, including storm water management pond slopes, that drain waters from the site must be stabilized within 200' of any property edge or discharge point, including storm sewer inlets, within 24 hours of

Temporary or permanent ditches or swales used as sediment containment during construction do not need to be stabilized during temporary period of use and shall be stabilized within 24 hours after no longer used as sediment containment

Mulch, hydromulch, tackifier, or similar practice shall not be used in any portion of the wetted perimeter of a temporary or permanent drainage ditch or swale section with a continuous slope of greater than 2 percent.

Energy dissipation shall be installed at all temporary or permanent pipe outlets within 24 hours of connection to a surface water or permanent stormwater treatment system

The Contractor shall phase construction and use construction methods to the extent practical to minimize exposed soils. The project phasing shall be documented in the Weekly Erosion and Sediment Control Schedule.

SEDIMENT CONTROL PRACTICES

Down gradient BMPs including perimeter BMPs must be in place before up gradient land- disturbing activities begin and shall remain in place until final stabilization.

All BMPs that have been adjusted or removed to accommodate short-term activities shall be re-installed or replaced the earlier of the end of the work day or before the next precipitation event even if the activity is not complete

Inlet BMPs may be removed for specific safety concerns. The BMPs shall be replaced as soon as the safety concern is resolved. The removal shall be documented in the SWPPP as a SWPPP amendment

Temporary stockpiles must have sediment control BMPs. The Contractor shall prepare and submit to the Engineer a SWPPP amendment showing the location of temporary stockpiles and the BMPs for each stockpile. The SWPPP amendment must meet the minimum requirements of Section 9 of the Permit.

Soil compaction shall be minimized and topsoil shall be preserved, unless infeasible or if construction activities dictate soil compaction or topsoil stripping.

The use of polymers, flocculants, or other sedimentation treatment chemicals are not proposed as part of this SWPPP as designed by the Engineer. If methods or phasing of construction require the use of any of these chemicals, the Contractor shall prepare and submit to the Engineer a SWPPP amendment that meets the minimum requirements of Section 9 of the Permit.

TEMPORARY SEDIMENTATION BASINS

A temporary sedimentation basin has not been included in this SWPPP as designed by the Engineer. If a basin is later determined to be desirable or necessary the Contractor shall prepare and submit to the Engineer a SWPPP amendment. Temporary sedimentation basins shall meet or exceed the minimum requirements of Section 14 of the Permit and shall include a basin draining plan meeting or exceeding the minimum requirements of Section 10 of the Permit. Where the site discharges to Special and/or Impaired Waters the SWPPP amendment shall also meet or exceed the minimum requirements of Section 23 of the

DEWATERING

A dewatering plan has not been included in this SWPPP as designed by the Engineer. If dewatering is required for this project, the Contractor shall prepare and submit to the Engineer a SWPPP amendment. All dewatering shall meet or exceed the min requirements of Section 10 of the Permit.

POLLUTION PREVENTION

Products and materials that have the potential to leach pollutants that are stored on the site must be stored in a manner designed to minimize contact with stormwater. Materials that are not a source of potential contamination to stormwater or that are designed for exposure to stormwater are not required to be covered.

Hazardous materials including but not limited to pesticides, fertilizer, petroleum products, curing compounds and toxic waste must be properly stored and protected from stormwater exposure as recommended by the manufacturer in an access restricted

Solid waste must be stored, collected and disposed of in compliance with Minnesota Administrative Rules Chapter 7035.

Portable toilets must be positioned so that they are secure and will not be tipped or knocked over. Sanitary waste must be disposed of properly in accordance with Minn. R. CH 7041.

Exterior vehicle or equipment washing on the project site shall be limited to a defined area of the site. No engine degreasing is allowed on site. A sign must be installed adjacent to each washout facility that requires site personnel to utilize the proper facilities for disposal of concrete and other washout wastes.

The Contractor shall prepare and submit a SWPPP amendment detailing the location and BMPs proposed for storage of materials, solid waste, portable toilets, and exterior vehicle or equipment washing on the site. The SWPPP amendment shall include a spill prevention and response plan that is appropriate for the materials proposed to be on the site. The SWPPP amendment shall meet or exceed the minimum requirements of Section 12 of the Permit.

INSPECTION & MAINTENANCE

A trained person shall routinely inspect the entire construction site at the time interval indicated on this sheet of the SWPPP during active construction and within 24-hours after a rainfall event greater than 0.5 inches in 24 hours. Following an inspection that occurs within 24-hours after a rainfall event, the next inspection must be conducted at the time interval indicated in the Receiving Waters Table found on the SITE PLAN AND INFORMATION SHEET of the SWPPP.

All inspections and maintenance conducted during construction must be recorded on the day it is completed and must be retained with the SWPPP. Inspection report forms are available in the Project Specifications. Inspection report forms other than those provided shall be approved by the engineer.

The Contractor may request a change in inspection schedule for the following conditions:

- a. Inspections of areas with permanent cover to be reduced to once per month.
- b. Inspections of areas that have permanent cover and have had no construction activity for 12 months to be suspended
- c. Inspections of areas where construction is suspended due to frozen ground conditions, inspections to be suspended until the earlier of within 24 hours of runoff occurring, or upon resuming construction.

No change in inspection schedule shall occur until authorized by the Engineer.

Inspections must include

- 1. All erosion prevention and sediment control BMPs and Pollution Prevention Management Measures to ensure integrity and
- 2. Surface waters, including drainage ditches and conveyance systems for evidence of erosion and sediment deposition.
- 3. Construction site vehicle exit locations, streets and curb and gutter systems within and adjacent to the project for sedimentation from erosion or tracked sediment from vehicles
- 4. Infiltration areas to ensure that no sediment from ongoing construction activity is reaching the infiltration area and that equipment is not being driven across the infiltration area.

All non-functioning BMPs and those BMPs where sediment reaches one-half (1/2) of the depth of the BMP, or in the case of sediment basins one-half (1/2) of the storage volume, must be repaired, replaced, or supplemented by the end of the next business day after discovery, or as soon as field conditions allow.

Permittees must repair, replace or supplement all nonfunctional BMPs with functional BMPs by the end of the next business day after discovery, or as soon as field conditions allow.

Any sediment that escapes the site must be removed and the area stabilized within 7 calendar days of discovery unless precluded by legal, regulatory, or physical access in which case the work shall be completed within 7 calendar days of authorization. Paved surfaces such as streets shall have any escaped or tracked sediment removed by the end of the day that it is discovered. Sediment release, other than paved surfaces that can be cleaned up with street sweeping shall be reported immediately upon discovery to the Engineer.

PUBLIC WATER RESTRICTIONS:

For public waters that have been promulgated "work in water restrictions" during fish spawning time frames, all exposed soil areas that are within 200 feet of the water's edge, and drain to these waters must complete stabilization within 24-hours during the time period. MN DNR permits are not valid for work in waters that are designated as infested waters unless accompanied by an Infested Waters Permit or written notification has been obtained from MN DNR stating that such permit is not required. There is no exception for pre-existing permits. If a MN DNR Permit has been issued for the project and the water is later designated as infested, the Contractor shall halt all work covered by the MN DNR Permit until an Infested Waters Permit is obtained or that written notification is obtained stating that such permit is not required.

FINAL STABILIZATION

Final Stabilization is not complete until all the following requirements have been met

- 1. Substantial Completion has been reached and no ground disturbing activities are anticipated
- 2. Permanent cover has been installed with an established minimum uniform perennial vegetation density of 70 percent of its expected final growth. Vegetation is not required in areas where no vegetation is proposed by this project such as impervious surfaces or the base of a sand filter.

- 3. Accumulated sediment has been removed from all permanent stormwater treatment systems as necessary to ensure the system is operating as designed
- 4. All sediment has been removed from conveyance systems
- 5. All temporary synthetic erosion prevention and sediment control BMPs have been removed. BMPs designated on the SWPPP to remain to decompose on-site may remain.
- 6. For residential construction only, permit coverage terminates on individual lots if the structures are finished and temporary erosion prevention and downgradient perimeter control is complete, the residence sells to the homeowner, and the nermittee distributes the MPCA's "Homeowner Fact Sheet" to the homeowner
- 7. For agricultural land only (e.g., pipelines across cropland), the disturbed land must be returned to its preconstruction agricultural use prior to submitting the NOT.
