Called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

FLASHCAM-880SX PORTABLE DETERRENT SYSTEM

The FlashCAM-880SX is a pro-active deterrence/investigation tool. Because of its high resolution low light imaging capabilities it is very useful as an aide to apprehension and prosecution of crime suspects. However, due to its integrated crime prevention features, it is not dependent on a police response to be effective.

APPLICATIONS

Successful applications for the FlashCAM include prevention and apprehension of crimes such as:

GRAFFITI / ILLEGAL DUMPING / METAL THEFT / VANDALISM / TRESPASSING / LOITERING

FEATURES

- **PORTABLE:** Completely self-contained. Solar charged battery, no hard wiring required.
- SD CARD OVERWRITE: Perpetual image storage, overwriting oldest images for newest.
- QUICK INSTALLATION: Simple "quick move adapter" installation with lag bolts or signage banding.
- **RUGGED DESIGN:** Vandal resistant. Made of 16 gauge steel with 0.375 polycarbonate windows.
- USER CONFIGURABLE CAMERA: Zoom settings, exposure settings, shutter speed
- CONFIGURABLE IR MOTION SENSOR: Customizable sensor delays and zone masking options to reduce false triggers.
- VARIABLE OPERATING MODES: Customizable modes of operation such as night time only and user configurable times of operation.
- BRIGHT FLASH: Captures night time images and acts as deterrence, which can also be disabled.
- **HIGH RESOLUTION IMAGE:** 18+ Mega pixel images identifies facial details up to 150' and license plates at 250'. Used for suspect identification and prosecution.
- CUSTOMIZABLE AUDIO MESSAGE: Loud message acts as deterrent.
- WIRELESS IMAGE DOWNLOAD: For review and download of images in the field, connect to laptop, tablet, or smartphone.

HOW IT WORKS

The FlashCAM-880SX senses motion up to 100 feet away. When motion is detected the system starts taking high resolution digital photographs. A bright flash goes off (if it is dark), and a loud voice message warns the intruder to "leave the area now" and that his photograph is being taken. Photos are 18+ megapixels clear enough to identify vandals and capture a license plate number more than 250ft away in TOTAL DARKNESS.

HOW TO MOUNT THE SYSTEM

The system comes with a Wall Mount. This is a heavy-duty bracket that can be mounted to utility poles or wooden studs using lag bolts, or cement walls using anchor bolts. A padlock is supplied to secure the
